European Jewry remains as insecure now as it was before the war.

We must secure their passage from the Diaspora and their entry into Eretz Israel with our own passports, and we must demonstrate to the world that ours is not a people that depends on or can be deterred by declarations, but marches resolutely in advance of the support and sympathy which we are entitled to expect from the civilised world.

The Jewish people dare not rest until all those who strive to return to Eretz Israel are repatriated.

ERETZ ISRAEL CITIZENSHIP

All Jews seeking repatriation will be free to opt for Eretz Isrzel citizenship even before their repatriation, thus enabling the Provisional Government to include them immediately in the General Register of its citizens, and to demonstrate that it is only the and to demonstrate that it is only the forcible prevention of repatriation that has hitherto delayed the attainment of a Jewish majority in Eretz Israel.

In accord with the principle of free entry into Eretz Israel for all Jews from all parts of the world, the constitution of the Jewish State shall lay it down for all time that the citizenship of any Jew or his location shall be no bar to his right of entry into Eretz Israel.

DIPLOMATIC REPRESENTATION

The Provisional Government must set up a representation at the United Nations, and must, like National Movements of the past, embark on a strugggle to secure international re-

THE ARABS

We regard the Arabs in Eretz Israel as fellow citizens entitled to the full rights enjoyed by all other citizens of the Jewish State. The constitution for the country must give expression in legal form to this principle.

There exists in Eretz Israel no prob-lem of Jewish-Arab relations that cannot be peacefully resolved.

cannot be peacefully resolved.

The special conditions in this field have been produced by the Mandatory Power which has stood between them and prevented the development of harmonious relations. The only guarantee of harmonious Jewish-Arab relations will be the establishment of a progressive and democratic State of Eretz Israel whose Government will forge bonds of friendship within Eretz Israel and with the neighbouring Arab States.

FRONTIERS

The area of Eretz Israel embraces The area of Eretz Israel embraces the territory east and west of the Jordan. Opposing every form of partition, we repudiate the illegal exclusion of the Transjordanian portion of Eretz Israel. It will be the task of the Provisional Government to reunite Eastern and Western Eretz Israel Israel.

PROBLEMS

We are bound to no particular economic or social doctrine, other than the principle of democratic government. Our paramount aim is the speediest possible attainment of the Jewish State. Our sole consideration in the choice of methods must be the free to opt for Eretz Israel citizentlement. All social and economic groups in Eretz Israel, who have suffered equally in the European extermination and who are faced equally by the political and economic insecurity in Eretz Israel, must adapt their existing structures to the speediest possible absorption of the mass immigration. migration.

All energies must be united in the vital task of achieving Statehood. When the Jewish State is attained the citizens of Eretz Israel, following the practice of normal and democratic states, will freely elect their Government and establish a social and political democracy.

DEMOCRATISATION OF CONGRESS

We shall at the forthcoming Congress press for the abolition of the paid franchise, with the object of transforming the Zionist Congress into a true democratic Jewish assembly.

At this decisive hour, when vast umbers of our people await the greater exodus, we call upon all Jews, those who have been uprooted and those who are still possessed of means and freedom of action, to cast away the old, worn-out and discredited methods, and to join us in a great effort of liberation.

I want to be what I am without shame and cringing. It's about time for me and my daughter. So what about an American visa or a certificate to Palestine?"

The Lady by this time was out of bed. Wrapped in her dressing gown she stood near us, her finger accu-singly pointed at the Colonel and me:

"You come to visit a Lady," she complained, "and instead of making compliments you discuss politics. Is that a nice thing to do?"

The Colonel, ever gallant, rose, his medals tinkling as he moved.
