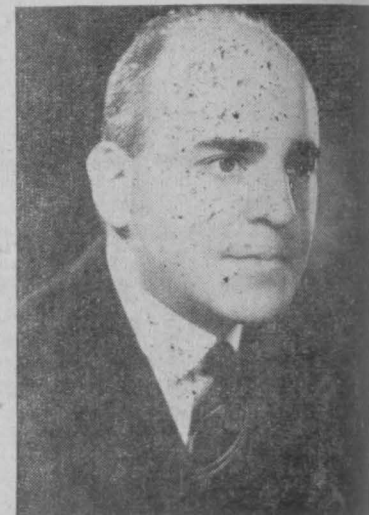

## Visit of Solomon-Celebrated Pianist



ONE of the greatest musical events in the history of South Africa is the arrival next week of the celebrated Jewish pianist from England, Solomon.

Solomon has just completed a triumphant tour of Australia and New Zealand, and is flying to Johannesburg direct from Australia. Unfortunately, his stay here will be limited to four weeks, so he will only give a small number of concerts in the main centres of South Africa.

This great artist got there the hard way. His father was a poor Russian-Jewish emigre toiling as a tailor's worker in London's East End, but appreciated his son's extraordinary talent, and sacrifices were demanded at home until the prodigy was launched. Although Solomon's parents had no musical background, his father had a well-developed instinct for good music.

At the age of eight he made his debut at the Queen Hall, but shortly afterwards he retired from the public eye and studied the piano under Levi in Paris. He made his reappearance in London some five years later when he proved himself one of those rare instances of a prodigy unspoiled by early triumphs, and is now accepted as one of the greatest living masters of his instrument.

Solomon is an amiable bachelor, aged 42. During the war he toured the main battlefronts of the world, giving charity concerts to the troops, and in the last Birthday Honours List was awarded the C.B.E. by the King, for whom he has also given a Command Performance at Buckingham Palace.

His two recitals in Johannesburg will be at the City Hall on October 14, and the Empire on October 20.

The major works in his first programme will be Beethoven's Waldstein Sonata in C Major, and Carnival, Opus 9 by Schumann. Other items are Rhapsody in C Minor, Opus 79, No. 2 by Brahms, Impromptu in F Sharp, Two Etudes and Nocturne in D Flat by Chopin.

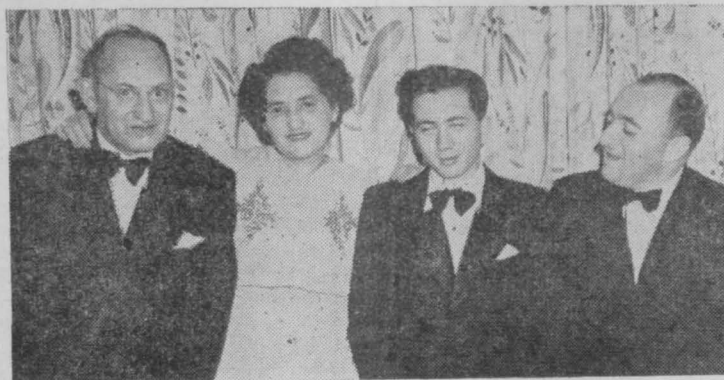
