Celebrity Violinist Coming to S. A.

Dr. Bronislaw Fryling

SOUTH Africa is shortly to be honoured by the visit of Dr. Bronis-law Fryling, the celebrity violinist from Poland.

Dr. Fryling was born of Jewish parents in Krakow. At the age of 8 he gave his first public concert. He continued his studies under Prof. Ottaker Sevcik, the renowned Czechoslovakium tascher and often slovakian teacher, and after a few years made an extensive European

When his father died he laid his violin aside for the time being and worked as barrister and scientist at Krakow University. During 1935-1939 he defended Polish Jews against points as a part of the property unjust accusations made by Fascists and other reactionaries. His notable pleas for the Jewish cause resulted in the saving of many Jewish lives.

After a series of harassing experiences during the present war, he was captured by the Russians. When they discovered he was an artist, they allowed him to make a tour of the Soviet Union.

When Dr. Fryling tours South Africa he will bring with him his beautiful Stradivarius violin. His pro-grammes will include a first world performance of Gagliano's Summer Phantasie, a work for violin and or-
