Polish Violinist to Tour Union with £10,000 Stradivarius

Dr. Bronislaw Fryling, who has come to the Union to give a series of concerts, has brought with him a Stradivarius violin dating back to 1719 and valued at £10,000.

He found this instrument in a famous English collection, and he will us it for the first time on a public platform on his tour of South Africa.

Being a top-ranking violinist, who started playing as a child of eight, by no means sums up Dr. Fryling achievements. To his doctorate of music he added a doctorate in law

and was for some time professor of penal law at the University of Cracow, his home town. He is the author of several books on musical authorities. education.

"For relaxation" from the lon hours of concentrated work on his vie lin, Dr. Fryling recently went on big game hunt in Central Africa.

After the death of his father i After the death of his father in 1926, Dr. Fryling felt he could never play the violin again, and in the need to escape from himself he took up motor racing, rising to be champion of Poland. Eventually, however, it was his music again which brought him galaxy. him solace

When war started Dr. Fryling was in the front line with the Polish Army. Captured by the Germans on September 13, 1939, he escaped the following day, only to be re-captured after three days' freedom. Later he again escaped by jumping from a train.
