Dr. Ben Bernstein

THE death took place in Cape Town of Dr. Ben Bernstein, President of the Cape Town Hebrew Congregation, at the age of 62.

Dr. Bernstein was born in Robertson and educated at S.A.C.S. He qualified in medicine at the London Hospital, and returned in 1910 to Cape Town, where he practised until his death his death.

For many years Dr. Bernstein has been closely associated with the mother synagogue of South Africa, and in 1945 he was elected President of the Congregation, a position which he filled with great distinction. Dr. Bernstein leaves a widow, a son, Dr. George Bernstein, who was awarded the M.B.E. during the last war, and a daughter, Miss Rosalie Bernstein.

The funeral was largely attended by representatives of Cape Town Jew-ish communal organisations and members of the Congregation. A Hesped was delivered by Chief Rabbi Israel Abrahams.
