He represented Eastern Province in a friendly inter-provincial match against Northern Transvaal, and was also a member of the E.P. touring Currie Cup team which played against Western Province, Boland and South-Western Districts. He gave an outstanding display in all three matches.

CHAMPION JOCKEY

WOULD Jewish jockey, "Cocky" Feldman break the record of 124 winning rides set up by jockey "Tiger" Wright last year? has been a question which racegoers in South Africa have been asking themselves recently.

This week the answer came. "Cocky" has not only broken the record, but bids fair to put up so high a figure for winning rides for the year that jockeys who try to emulate him in future will find it practically impossible to beat them.

"Cocky" Feldman, who has been in the headlines practically ever since he began riding in the early thirties in Cape Town, was born of Jewish parents about 34 years ago.

Like most parents who have mapped out a future for their son, his parents raised a great deal of opposition when they discovered that he had made a habit of hanging



around some racing stables near their home in Cape Town.

"They tried to stop me," says "Cocky," "but I was determined to apprentice myself to some trainer or other."

When he ultimately did so, trainers immediately noticed his superb horsemanship, and noted him as a future champion.

One newspaper columnist came out with the following, some little while after "Cocky" had made his debut as a jockey: "Are you the victim of the 'Feldman Complex'?" This is the latest disease in Cape Town. Perky little "Cocky" Feldman has almost hypnotised the racing fraternity. He has only to be mounted for his horse to become short priced. People believe that he is capable of winning on a cart-horse if he wants to.

Recently "Cocky" added to his triumphs by winning the King's Cup Handicap on Chesunt Hill in Durban. He treasures the Gold Cup which the King presented to him on that occasion.

"I hope to ride a good many years yet," says "Cocky," who to-day is reputed to have made more money out of racing than any other jockey. "I love riding."

You have only to watch him bringing home a winner to realise what a superb horseman he is.

He is riding Thorium in the Durban July.
