OPHIR WELCOMES MR. DAVID DAINOW

THERE was a large attendance at the "Ophir" meeting at the Carlton Hotel on Saturday night, August 30, when Mr. David Dainow, former editor of "The Zionist Record" was the guest of honour.

Speaking on "Reactions of a New-comer to Eretz-Israel", Mr. Dainow drew a composite picture of cultural life in Eretz-Israel. He spoke on the humour of the Yishuv, despite critical times, and related many anecdotes which illustrated the spirit of the community in Palestine.

The chairman and Mr. Edgar Bernstein, who had been introduced to Jewish journalism by Mr. Dainow many years ago, paid a tribute to the speaker. Cantor S. Mandel, with Bruno Raikin at the piano, gave a masterful rendering of Leivick's "Mimamakim"—which was a first performance in South Africa, and also one of Raisin's songs.

During the interval, Molly Picon and Jacob Kalich arrived and were warmly welcomed by the gathering. Mr. F. Zygielbaum paid a tribute to the work of both Molly Picon and Jacob Kalich, in particular with regard to the Yiddish Theatre. Both Miss Picon and Mr. Kalich addressed the gathering, the former delighting the audience with an excerpt in Yiddish from one of her shows.

Meeting in Honour of Mr. David Dainow

Mr. David Dainow was the guest of honour at a reception given by the Histadruth Ivriith, which took place at the Coronation Hall on Tuesday, 26th August.

Mr. Dainow, speaking in Hebrew, delivered a striking address on "The Humour of Modern Eretz Yisrael". He pointed out that new trends were noticeable in the development of Jewish humour. While the humour of the ghetto was bitter and most of the time destructive, the humour of new Eretz Yisrael was fresh and invigorating, pointing to the fact that a most significant change was taking place in the inner life of the Yishuv.

He illustrated his address with some very interesting and amusing stories, which he gleaned during his stay in Eretz Yisrael, and thus gave his audience a true insight into the life of the Yishuv, beyond the threatening and enervating headlines.

During the tea interval, Mrs. Tager led the audience in communal singing.
