NOTICE TO KOSHER BUTCHERIES

Kosher Butcheries are such as comply with the following regulations, namely:—

- (1) Sell Kosher meat only.
- (2) Are closed on Saturdays and all Jewish Holidays.
- (3) Are inspected by the Mashgiach of the Beth-Din.

All such butcheries display prominently a Certificate to the effect that they are under Beth-Din supervision.

The Beth-Din is not responsible for and does not guarantee the Kashruth of any other butcheries even though they may advertise as "Kosher" or "Strictly Kosher."

Meat delicacies, such as Wursht, Smoked Beef, etc., are guaranteed Kosher only when bearing a seal and label "Behechsher Beth-Din."

All poultry sold as Kosher must bear a label of the Beth-Din, stamped with the name of the Shochet and the date of killing. Particular attention should be paid that the seal and cord are firmly attached, to prevent the illegal transfer of seals to non-Kosher poultry.

DEFAUW CONCERT AT CITY HALL

Concert-going audiences in Johannesburg are only now becoming conscious of the all-important role of the conductor. The series of symphony concerts, brilliantly conducted by Desire Defauw, has consolidated this fact and has certainly left an indelible impression on the musically-minded.

The mammoth orchestra under the leadership of Bram Verhoef, was in responsive form at the Tuesday night concert at the City Hall. Defauw had a body of disciplined players under his masterly direction and the large audience was quick to appreciate the artistry of the performance.

The programme opened with the "Overture to the Meistersingers", by Wagner, which swept to a magnificent grand finale with the sound of the full orchestra echoing through the hall.

"Le Chasseur Maudit," by Cesar Franck, the least known of the works on the programme, proved to be the most popular. This charming work has a story attached to it, which can easily be traced throughout the music. Defauw exploited the dramatic content of the score to the full, steering the orchestra from shimmering, mysterious sostenutos to shattering spine-chilling climaxes. Two Slavonic Dances, by Dvorak, and the exotic, oriental Prince Igor Dances, by Borodin, concluded the first half of the programme.

The second half of the concert was devoted to Sibelius' Fifth Symphony, characteristically powerful and sonorous. The last movement, with its grandiose theme in the horns, reached majestic heights when the organ, played by John Connell, lent a resounding quality to the full orchestra.

By special request, Desire Defauw gave a final concert with the orchestra on Thursday, September 11.
