MOVEMENT FOR PROGRESSIVE JUDAISM GATHERING GROUND IN BRITAIN Interview With Dr. R. Brasch

RABBI DR. R. BRASCH, who recently arrived from England to take up his position as the newly-appointed Minister of the Springs and District Reform Congregation, told a representative of the "Zionist Record" at a press conference that the movement for progressive Judaism was gaining ground in England and all over the world, particularly among the youth.

Dr. Brasch officiated as Minister of various Reform synagogues in London and went to Ireland to establish the Dublin Reform Congregation. The attitude of the Reform movement all over the world was to help in the establishment of a Jewish State in Palestine, he said.

"There is a big Reform youth move-ment in England," said Dr. Brasch,

"but this movement has affiliated itself to an organisation which embraces all Jewish youth movements. A feature of Jewish life in England is the clubs for boys and girls, which include representatives from every sphere of Jewish life. These clubs meet regularly and have discussions, brains-trusts, debates and outside speakers from all walks of life."

Dr. Brasch thought that South African Jewish youth would do well to establish clubs along those lines and try to gain an open-minded, all-round outlook on Jewish affairs.

Dr. Brasch has a strong attachment to South Africa, as his father was one of the early pioneers to arrive in Cape Town. Many other of his relatives have taken an active interest in Jewish affairs in this country.
