**HERZL ZUCKERMAN REPORTS
FOREIGN TRADE INSTITUTE
TRADE WITH S.A.**

MR. HERZL ZUCKERMAN, the trade delegate of the Foreign
Institute and representative of the Manufacturers' Association
Palestine, has returned to Tel Aviv from South Africa and has reported
the manufacturers and various institutions connected with the pro
and extension of Palestine's export trade. He has also commenced
whether all the orders booked during his stay in South Africa have
executed.

A large number of these orders have
already been despatched and some
have reached South Africa.

It is understood, however, that the
present conditions in Palestine are
making the tasks of the manufac-
turers and of the export organisa-
tions extremely difficult. Neverthe-
less, it has been clearly decided that
orders which are received must be
executed, and deliveries will be made
as near as possible in accordance
with indents.

A further disturbing factor has
been that, owing to the position in
Palestine, insurance rates have been
increased and this unfortunately adds
to the cost of Palestine's goods. En-
deavours are being made to bring
these costs back to normal.

Despite these problems, production
is continuing and the Foreign Trade
Institute, together with the manufac-
turers, will make every endeavour to
deliver goods in accordance with in-
dents.

Manufacturers are also going into
the reports submitted by Mr. Zucker-
man on the special requirements of
the South African market and it is
stated of the coming two months,
to be anticipated that despite the ob-
