

Daughter of Distinguished Anglo-Jewish Family

Esther Salaman, a blonde and impressive lieder and art singer from London, is at the moment visiting Johannesburg with her husband, Paul Hamburger, the Viennese pianist.

Miss Salaman is the daughter of Dr. Redcliffe Salaman, F.R.S., J.P., a prominent name in the world of science; her mother is Nina Salaman, who, in her turn, is well known in the literary world.

Miss Salaman collaborated with Dr. Zangwill in the translation of many of his most beautiful verses of the Jewish festival liturgy. She has published a translation of the poems of Yehuda Halevi and also translated a number of his poems into English.

Broadcast Tour

Miss Salaman, who is here on a broadcast and concert tour, has performed over the B.B.C. home service many times, including groups of songs in the Children's Hour. She has also appeared in television. She has given solo recitals in London and Provincial towns, and she sings for the Arts Council of Great Britain and the British Council.

Her husband, Mr. Paul Hamburger, came to London from Vienna before the war. He is a British musical scholar and studied at the Royal College of Music under Frank Bridge and later under Franz Schreker. As a concert pianist he has performed throughout the British

Isles. Apart from solo work, he has specialised in chamber music and is also an accompanist of note.

In London Mr. Hamburger has won acclaim for his original coaching in interpretation, particularly of more advanced musicians. On his return to London Mr. Hamburger is to perform over the Third Programme of the B.B.C. The Third Programme is the "high-brow" section of the B.B.C.

Miss Salaman and Mr. Hamburger gave their first concert over the air this week.

ESTHER SALAMAN AND PAUL HAMBURGER TO APPEAR AT CITY CONCERT
