Mrs. Clara Schwartz (Salisbury)

Mrs. Clara Schwartz (Salisbury), who died in Salisbury on Tuesday night, October 19, in her 60th year, was a well-known personality and energetic worker for all benevolent causes in Rhodesia. Arriving from Manchester, England, in 1912, she married Mr. David Schwartz, the senior partner of the firm of Robinson and Schwartz in Salisbury.

She soon became a prominent worker in the Jewish Community. Her enthusiasm in the cause of the needy and her active charitable work during the war years gained her the esteem and admiration of her co-workers in the Salisbury Branch of the Loyal Women's Guild.

She is deeply mourned by her husband, her son and daughter, her three sisters and two brothers, one of whom is the well-known Professor P. Leon of the Leicester University, the author of "Ethics of Power" and "The Psychology of Courage." She will be sadly missed by a large circle of friends.

The third annual concert of Magen David Adom in S.A. (Johannesburg branches) will be presented at the City Hall on Monday, November 15, 1948.

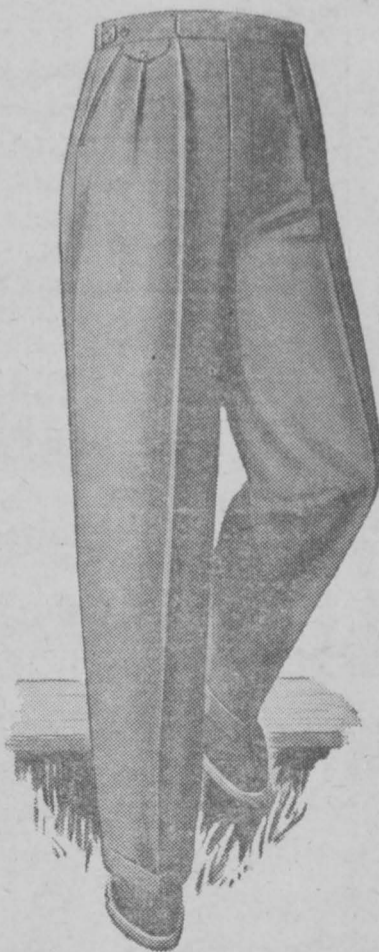
Popular singers and the Youth Symphony Orchestra, conducted by Solly Aronowsky, will render classical, folk and modern Palestinian songs and music.
