(Sic volo, sic jubeo, &c.) hebben meester gemaakt. Hierna zyn de spreken- de bewyzen in eenige der radicale hervormings-bladen, gedurende de laatste jaren voor handen;—ongelukkig is het nogtans, dat zy by hulle leer en aan den dag geleerde grondstellingen, geene middelen ter gelyker tyd hebben aan de hand gegeven, waardoor men het stormen van zoo veel Menschen bloed, in Parys, Brussel, Polen, enz. had kunnen sparen en voorkomen, welke voor het grootste gedeelte in de laatste 14 a 15 maanden, op die plaatsen reeds gestort is, en geheel Europa wellicht zal doen rooken, om geene andere reden als om dat men het over de belan- gens van den Staat met elkanderen niet eens was. Wy willen niet ontkennen dat veele eene regimatige aanspraak op eene herziening en matige hervorming in de belangen van hun land konden, ja moesten maken;—doch wy be- wezen dat, zonder dat zoo veele burger-oorlogen en bloedstortingen noodig waren, een betere staat van zaken had kunnen en zoude geboren worden, indien niet het woeste gemen, door anhitzen en opruying der radicale hervormers in eenige dier bladen, overal was gemaakt geworden; en, dat in elk dier landen eene hervorming kon bewerkt of daargesteld zyn, zonder dat het gehele staatsgebouw om- verve geworpen of verdeeld had behoeven te worden. Daar nu in Europa een groot gedeelte s'antkundigen uit den middenstand of het volk, vooral in Engeland, genoegzaam al hune staat- kundige wysheid, dat wy het zoo noemen, uit de dagbladen trekken, en die voor zoo veele godsdienstigen houden;—en daar genoegzaam elke Vorst of Soeverein, het zy by zachtzinnig, edelmoedig en liberal, dan wel despotiek en wreed zy, met de wapenen die aan de zoo- dinnige schryvers ten dienste staan, zoo als e- heden en lasten, dodelyngelyk wordt an- gevoelen, terwyl alle radicale hervormers en revolutionairen niet in de wolven worden ver- heven; zoo kan het niet missen of elke troon in Europa zal, door dit schandelyk misbruik van de vryheid der drukpers,—aangemoedigd door het doozinnig en woest gemen,—al meer en meer aan het waakelen worden gebracht;—en een Koning zal wel den niet meer veiliger zyn op zynen troon, dan een reiziger in een land van dieven en moordenaars.

Laatste Europeisch Nieuws.

BREDA, JULY 25.—Het exameneren der troepen op de Legerplaats van het Garizoen, door den Koning op den 23, heeft zyne Majesteit gelykheid gegeven om zich zelve bekend te maken met den geest die het geheel Leger be- zield. Onder de omstandigheden, die de byzon- der-attentie verdienen, zyn de volgende:—

Na dat de Koning en de Prins van Oranje naar 't Hertogenbosch vertrokken waren, verzamelden zyne Koninkl. Hoogheid Prins Fradrik, de Gene- ral en de Officieren van rang, voor de Tent van den Prins van Saxe Weimar. An het midden van den cirkel staande, die door 't grootst gedeelte der Officieren die in den morgen de troepen ge- commandeerd hadden; was gevormd; zeide zyne Koninglyke Hoogheid; dat zyne Majesteit ten uiter- ste voldaan; was over de goede verlooping der troepen, en inzonderheid door de geestdrift die zy betoond hadden, en door de behaalde blyken van toegenegenheid; welke Zyne Majes- teit in den morgen ontvingen had.

Het oogmerk is misschien zeer naby, myne Heeren, woe die de Prins er by, wanneer de Kon- ing van deze geestdrift en van zynen wensch om den vyand te ontmoeten, gebruyk zal kunnen maken, ten einde de regten van Holland niet het zwak in de hand te verdrigen.

Indien het noodzakelyk mogte worden het zwaard te trekken, verkouwt Zyne Majesteit, dat hy dezelfde bewyzen van getrouwheid en verkleeftheid in het Leger zal vinden.

Deze weinige woorden, met een zigtbare aan- doening gesproken, maakten eenen diepen indruk op alle die tegenwoordig waren, en tranen rolden over de wangen van onze oude Krygsvlieden. General Van Geen bedankte toen, in den naam van de tegenwoordig zynde Officieren, zyne Kon- inglyke Hoogheid, voor het strolend kompliment hen juist in den naam des Konings gemaakt, en voegde er met geestdrift by.

"Dat Zyne Majesteit zich in zyne verwachtingen niet bedrogen zou vinden;—dat hy hem verzoekt Zyne Majesteit met de gevoelens van het gansch Leger bekend te maken; dat sy alle, gedachtig aan hune eed en, zich wederom by deze geleendheid aan de zaak des Konings en des Lands toeviden, bereid zyde hun bloed voor deze zaak te storten. Uwe Koninglyke Hoogheid kan den Koning verze- keren, dat geen duim gronds van Holland verloren zal gaan, zonder dat hetzelve door bloed gekocht is!

Wy zweren het!—Daar op herhaalden alle die tegenwoordig waren, met ongedekte hoofden en uitgestrekte handen, "Wy zweren het!" welke woorden als een elektrick vuur door al de geleerden van ons leger vioden.

De Prins was voor een oogenblyk te zeer ontro- pen te antwoorden; zych zeiven spoedig hersteld hebbende, zeide hy, dat het hem speit dat de Koning by dit schouwspel niet tegenwoordig was, maar dat hy niet nalaten zou den Koning nog op den zelfden avond met de byzonderheden van hetzelve bekend te maken.

Inwoners van Antwerpen! ik stroom my zelven met het vooruitzicht, dat gy, in deze omstandig- heden zult voortgaan my dat vertrouwen te schenken, hetwelk gy, my tot op dezen dag betoud hebt. Neemt elk hulpmiddel by der hand, dat voorzichtheid en uw eigen belang u aanbevelen en vertrouwt de bescherming van uwe personen en goederen aan de civile en mili- taire autoriteiten toe.—Antwerpen 2 Augustus.

DAG-ORDER VOOR HET LEGER IN HET VELD. Door den Koning mynen Vader, tot het opperbevelhebberschap van zyn leger geroepen zynde, plaats ik my zelven aan dezelve als op den dag, dat het woord "Voortwaards" door hem werd gesproken.

De bewyzen van getrouwheid en verkleeftheid door U. veld aan den dag geleid, zyn de waarborgen voor den Koning en het land, even als voor my de moed, die ik verkerd heb door s' blydheid zal worden in het veld van stryd, wanneer gy daartoe geroepen wordt, het gees waerachlyk binnen weinige dagen het geval zal, ten einde door geweld van wapenen bilyke voorwaarden al te eischen, voer de scheiding van dat gedeelte van het Koningryk het welk zich aan de regering van eenen Prins heeft onttrokken, voor wien wy gered zyn, ons lieven en onze bezittingen op te offeren.

By het nemen van geweld maakt de Koning geen einde aan de onderhandelingen die voort gaan, ofschoon zy tot nog toe vruchtloos zyn geweest. Zyne Afgezanten in de Conferentie te London, zullen niet ophouden de regten der natie voor te staan en te beschermen. Wat my zelven aangaat, wanneer ik wy die moed van zoo vrede mynre mede makkers, die ik nog rondom my zie, te winnen breng, en wanneer ik my tot de geschiedenis van ons land wilde, welke my zegt wat ik van deslyke vrywilligers en burgermagt kan verwachten, gevoel ik dat de moeyelykheid van de gewigtige aan my toevertrouwd zaak, door uwen moed aamerkellyk verlijt word.

Sedert Quatro-Bras en Waterloo, zyn wy nog niet in zulke omstandigheden, als ons nu verzoegen, geplaatst geweest.—Veld bestryke gebeurtenissen hebben ons mede plaats ge- geven, welke voor het grootste gedeelte voordelig voor het Koningryk zyn geweest;—maar sedert de laatste twaalf maan-

den hebben er gebeurtenissen plaats gevonden, welke van den rampspoedigsten aard voor het land zyn geweest, om myn pligt, en de wil des Konings, hebben my geroepen in de veld te treden. Alle myne verwachten waren op de om- kalfen die het Koningryk droegen, en welke wy nu onder- vinden, af te wets; maar door de middelen door my gebruik- tene gunstige uitgang hebben gehad, ondervind ik dat ik in de ten dertwelfde maanden heb. De hoergetrouden die my aantroffen waren van den invaderant aard; maar op hoop ik al te bewyzen, dat het bloed van den Prins van Nassau door myne adere vloet, en dat geen opoffering voor my te gering zal zyn om de veld handelykheid van ons land te ver- vullen, en de welken onze voortduren dikwyls zoo gublyklyk te zyn. Het overblyfsel magt gestreden hebben.

WILHELM PRINS VAN ORANJE. Hoofdstaatsreken, Reeds 1 Aug. 1851. Een prietate brief van eenen Officier, gedateekend te Brussel Aug. 11, segget dat zyn Regiment, onder ontvangen had, een vrees; in den morgen, voer te verschieren.—Broedische Courant Aug. 22. Het is niet ongevoerlyd te verstaan dat de hardnekkigheid van den Koning van Holland aenleiding tot Oorlog zal geven, of ten minste voor eenen tyd die vrydenschappelyk schikking der zamenkomsten tusschen die twee geslachten van het geroepen Koninkryk der Nederlanden zal beletten, die de Conferentie te London, zoo begreep waren te bevorderen, en welke het aanvaarden van den Belgischen troon door Prins Leopold schon daerstellen. Men vernomt in brieven van Antwerpen van den 2 dezer dat het eindigen van den wapenstilstand bepaald was op den 4 de (vrijdag) en dat gevolglyk na dien tyd men aan beide zyde de vryheid had om elk oogenblyk de vyandelykheid te hervatten.

De Hollandse Leger was naar de Belgische Grenzen voort- getrokken de Koning en zyne afgezanten hadden ons lang- geveerd, en het Gouvernement had de laatste Beslissingen al al het geen in hun vermogen was gedaan, om de ver- vestingen te versterken en het Leger te verzoegen, verzoekt dat dit Koninglyk huizek dezelfde besluit een versterken en den moed bevestigen.



The cholera morbus is everywhere on the Rhine. It is being as they say, as they are, as well as at Danzig, Königsberg, Marienburg, &c. &c. Wherever there has been any communication with the Russians, contamination has been sure to follow. The Prussian Authorities are using every exertion to prevent its extending this way. A courier has just been formed along the banks of the Oder, as far as Troppau, so that, in the event of our being sent back from the frontier, we must submit to a quarantine of three weeks, as all the Prussian territory between that river and Poland is placed, by the new regulations, under quarantine. The Russians are said to have crossed the Vistula, to the number of 60,000 men, at Modlin, about two post stations from Warsaw, and to have entirely surrounded that city on this side of it. They aim at the reduction of Warsaw by any means that chance and circumstances may render most favourable to their purpose. It does not seem, however, that this advance of affairs has in the least slackened the courage of the Poles. Besides the garrison of Praga, which is strong enough to defend the place against any attack, there are on this side of the city 30,000 regular troops, and a great number of irregular ones, by whom it is expected that the Russians will be soon attacked. The friends of the Poles will soon compel the enemy to re-cross the Vistula. Nothing certain, however, is known, as to their real hopes and resources, as communications are nearly cut off with Warsaw. -Warsaw, Aug. 5, 1831.

DUTCH PAPERS.

Breda, July 25, 1831. The review of the troops in camp at the garrison by the King, on the 23d, gave His Majesty an opportunity to make himself acquainted with the spirit which animates the whole army. Among the circumstances which deserve particular attention are the following: - After the King and the Prince of Orange had sat for Boile-Duc, his Royal Highness Prince Frederick assembled the Generals and superior officers before the tent of the Prince of Saxe-Weimar. Standing in the middle of a circle formed of the greater part of the officers who commanded the troops in the review in the morning. "The moment is, perhaps, very near at hand, gentlemen," added the Prince, "when His Majesty will have occasion to make use of this enthusiasm, and of this desire to encounter the enemy - to defend, sword in hand, the rights of Holland. Should it become necessary to draw the sword, His Majesty relies on finding in the army the same proofs of attachment and fidelity." "These few words, delivered with visible emotion, made a deep impression on all present, and tears rolled down the cheeks of our veteran warriors." General Van Geen then thanked his Royal Highness, at the name of the officers present for the flattering compliment which he had just paid them in the name of His Majesty; and added, with warmth: - "That His Majesty should not find himself deceived in his expectations; that he requested the Prince to testify to His Majesty the sentiments of the army; that all of them, mindful of their oaths, might devote themselves, on this solemn occasion, to the cause of the King and the country, ready to shed their blood in that cause. Your Royal Highness may assure the King that not an inch of the territory of Holland shall be lost without being purchased by blood! We swear it!" Then all present uncovered, and with outstretched hands repeated: "We swear it!" which words, like electric fire, flew through all the ranks of the army. The Prince was for a moment too much moved to answer. Soon recovering he said he regretted that His Majesty had not been present to witness such a scene, but that he should not fail to make His Majesty acquainted with all the particulars the same evening. -Times, July 30.

DOVER, Aug. 3, 5 o'clock.

There is a messenger just landed from Calais from Brussels: he brings over with him that there has been some fighting with the Dutch and Belgians troops, near Ghent; and since his arrival the Ostend steam-boat has arrived, confirming the event: there has been some lives lost on both sides. -Times, Aug. 4.

BELGIUM.

On the question of reading the order of the day, for the house to resolve itself into a committee of the whole house on the reform of Parliament (England) bill. Lord ELIOT said, that he must avail himself of this opportunity of putting a question to the noble Secretary for Foreign Affairs. It had been his (Lord Eliot's) fortune to have served for a considerable time in the kingdom of the Netherlands, and he had had ample opportunity of witnessing the mild and paternal government of the monarch who reigned over the united kingdom of Holland and the Netherlands. He had with pleasure observed the rapid progress which that country had made in internal prosperity. The Belgic States formed part of the kingdom which he might say, was called into existence by the Congress of Vienna, and its integrity was recognized by the great Powers of Europe. For the acquisition of territory thus obtained the King of Holland made great sacrifices. Some time since, the Belgians had thrown off their allegiance to the King of Holland. The great Powers would not resort to force to compel the Belgians to return to their allegiance, but they intervened between the parties by mediation. Throughout the negotiations the King of Holland had acted in the most conciliatory manner, though he would have been justified in considering the revolt of Belgium as an insurrectionary movement, and in having recourse to arms to quell it. It now appeared that Great Britain was a party to an arrangement by which the two kingdoms were to be separated. The effect which this proceeding had produced in Holland was very great. It had caused Sir Charles Bagot to be completely excluded from Society. There was but one cry throughout Holland; not against the hostility, but the uplicity of England. The question which I have to ask of the noble lord is, whether he has any objection to giving to the other acts of the negotiations relative to the affairs of Belgium the same publicity which he has given to the protocol. Lord PALMERSTON said that he would confine himself to answering the question of the noble lord. His answer was, that he had a material objection to giving to the other documents alluded to by the noble lord the same publicity which he had given to the protocol. It would tend to frustrate the object which the noble lord seemed to have in view, if his papers should be published. Lord ELIOT asked why the noble lord had given publicity to the protocol? Lord PALMERSTON said that he had thought it necessary to lay the protocol on the table of the house, because it had been alluded to in a particular manner in the speech of the King of the French to the Chambers. Mr. O'CONNELL protested against the eulogy which the noble lord had pronounced on the conduct of the King of Holland. (Hear.) -Times, Aug. 4, 1831.
