This proposition is now being considered by the Government, and it is known that the country has no authority to deprive them of the property by legislative enactments, without, in the first instance, providing an adequate compensation. It is not clear that the value of that which they shall be deprived of, and they express their fixed determination to resist to the utmost their power any attempt at the exercise of such arbitrary control as is assumed in the measure that is proposed.
