(Ephes 2 vs 11-22)

Expression of gratitude & joy at this service in reconstituting the Pta C of Churches. Most appropriate that it should start with a worship service thereby reflecting the central focus of the life & witness of the SACC - our commitment to Christ & his Church. No better passage to reflect that stand & message than Ephes 2 vs 22 to portray the aims & objectives, the role & witness of the SACC & its Reg. Councils. Because of the many misunderstandings which have, in many cases, deliberately been created in false propaganda ag. the SACC I need to make two initial remarks to put the record straight:

1. The SACC is no church on its own, it is no super-church or eccl. empire - & neither does it wish to be such a body. The SACC is and wishes to be nothing more but also nothing less than an extension of the life, witness & service of its member churches. The policy-making body of the SACC is its National Conference meeting once a year from whom the staff Reg.-Councils get their assignments (with the Exec. meeting quarterly, on beh. of the Natl Conf.)

2. The SACC is firmly based on our common confession of the Christian faith - the Word of God & the belief in God the Father, J-C the Son & the Holy Spirit. It has no doctrinal basis of its own - if it would have that it would no longer be a C of C but just another church denomination. The SACC has to face take

seriously the sin, the Tragedy & the dilemma of a divided Prot. community in S.A. & therefore it also reflects that tragedy (No other country in the world where so many Christians are so deeply divided in so many denominations & groups as in S.A.!)

The SACC seeks to discover & present a strong theological basis for all its work & witness, Role of Bible Study & Worship in Nat. Conf., Rec. meetings & Staff)

The Goals & Objectives of the SACC:

1. Unity .. (Eph. 2 vs 11-22) Both spiritual & organisational unity sought to be achieved via :-
 - Our member churches : 12 million
 - Church Unity Commission
 - Catholic Church (Observer Church Status)
 - Non-member Churches : the 3 White Dr C's the Baptist Church, the Pentecostal Churches the African Indep. Churches. Open invitation to all. if you ~~subscribe~~ to the ^{ancient} constitution, if you subscribe to the policy decisions of the Nat. Conf. - join — otherwise come & observe - we have nothing to hide, nothing to impose! wish once more here to night to extend this invitation to the NGK: our hand of fellowship is stretched out to you. take it!

2. Mission. The SCLC takes seriously ~~the~~ its task of mission & evangelism as entrusted to us by the N.C. Does not undertake mud campaigns of its own - but it provides the N. churches with the tools, stimulates thought & action.

1. To promote X-t. unity

5. To advocate areas of need & service
6. To keep some funds
