Musicians and actors have been auditioning in the Head's always-act-like-a-gentleman style, but it looks as though the mainstays will be Edi Nederlander, recently back from a bumner to England, Mac, and John Oakley-Smith.

Edi's guitar and vocals are sounding strong at rehearsals and the band's working hard.

Dave Marks' wife, Fran, gave the band its name while they were still thinking of the Dylan Show. It was a natural. The whole concept is the ELASTIC HEAD band.

"We all need some bread," said Mac explaining how the Beatles Show started happening.

"We're getting together slowly and there's one big thing — tuning on stage is OUT. That's the worst — that's why we don't get out of it, because then you're really splitting hairs".
