### Saturday September 6

### **Theatre Festival Finalists**

10am - 3pm and 6pm - 10pm

The three runners-up in last year's KZNACC Theatre Competition will be staged in a day-long celebration of the region's top development theatre. From the 18 productions staged last year, these came respectively 2nd, 3rd and 4th. The winning production represented South Africa in the SADC Theatre Festival in Mocambique in June this year. These productions have been re-worked and re-rehearsed with top theatre director, Jerry Pooe in preparation for this season.

Morning: From Vryheid region - Ukubekwa Kwe Nkosi

A show-case of traditional Zulu culture. This vibrant and energetic piece tells the story of the crowning of a Zulu king and is told in dance and music.

Afternoon: From Pietermaritzburg region - Psychopath

A delicate and well-written piece of extraordinary theatre which explores the complexity of the central character - a psychopath living in Fort Napier. It is told in a gentle mix of humour and empathy.

Evening: From Durban region- Guzana

An orphan struggles hard to achieve the education he desires in order to make himself a better person. The intricate family dynamics between himself and his adopted family are explored in this heartfelt production.

- Bharatanatyam and Kathak will be performed in solo and integrated styles. A selected group of North and South Indian dancers from UMDASA (United Musicians and Dancers Association of South Africa) will unveil this rich heritage of Indian

Dancing that is rarely seen in South Africa. The focus changes to a rendition of Indian music, songs and dance praising the Creator through original compositions in

Hindi, Tamil and Urdu.

On Saturday evening get ready for Ballroom Blitz! If you saw
Shall We Dance, you won't want to miss Ballroom Blitz - a mini presentation of all the Ballroom and Latin American rhythms. Lose yourself in the spectacle as the cast of Ballroom Blitz takes the floor transporting you from Spain to Brazil, from the USA to Austria.

The Kwa Zulu Natal Arts and Culture Council receives public money from the Government to support and develop the arts in the Province. The cash grant for 96/97 was R3 million. From these funds, the Arts Council provides regular grants to arts organisations and artists.

# Saturday September 20

### Children's Art:

10am - 2pm

A morning Children's Art Festival will celebrate the diverse talents and future of our children. Some of the best and most energetic young performers and artists from throughout Kwa-Zulu Natal will burst on to the stage to show why this province is the best in the country!

Radio and TV personalities and recording artists will be there with chances for everyone in the audience to win prizes and get autographs!

All the cultures from this vibrant province will be represented in a colourful display of singing, dancing, drama, poetry, crafts, art and much more. The programme is co-ordinated by Sharon Katz.

### **Iscathamiya:**

7pm - 10pm The SATMA (South African Traditional Music Association) led by Mr. P Msimang will present a programme of Iscathamiya - unaccompanied vocal harmonies which the likes of Ladysmith Black Mambazo brought to the world's notice. Mr. Msimang is acclaimed as being one of the great leaders and pioneers in the field of this hugely popular and accessible art-form. The programme will refresh our memories from the archives of the Ingomabusuku from the 1950's to the present day and shall feature top groups from around the region.

The provincial Arts Council has nine Regional Arts Councils: Durban, Empangeni, Greytown / Mapumulo, Ladysmith, Newcastle, Pietermaritzburg, Port Shepstone, Ulundi and Vryheid. The Regional Arts Councils are able to provide funding to arts groups in their areas.

# Friday September 26

Bands: 6pm - 10pm

ohnny Dimba from the Showbiz Foundation co-ordinates this evening of the best of the battle of the bands. Some of the bands featured include maskandi band Mfliseni Magubane, mbaqanga music of Moris Mthembu, blues band, No Name Brothers and a selection of Afro-Jazz bands. They will play to the strings of the Ntuthuko Brothers, Sana Mnguni, Bra Gib Kente, the Soul Brothers and many more.

# Saturday September 27

Choral: 6pm - 10pm

One of the distinctive features of this region is its rich choral heritage. This programme of indigenous music is presented with all the skills and artistry of the seasoned musicians and is co-ordinated by the Imvunge Choral Association. Choral composers featured include Khulekani Magubane, Mzilikazi Khumalo and Ben Mnominya. Choral leaders include Mr. W Dubazana of Amazwi Ka Zulu, Prof. Khabi Mngoma of Ionian Choir and Inkosi B Mayundla of the Ingwemabala school choir.
