

ABAFANA BESISHINGISHANE - which means Men of Action - are the leading exponents of mbaganga music.

Abafana Besishingishane consists of Potatoes Zuma – lead vocalist, otherwise known as 'His Master's Voice'. Previously a member of Abafana Baseqhundeni. Joseph Mthimkhulu – the other groaner in the group, with a deep, deep voice. Daniel Nhlapho and Valapi Mthimkhulu – middle voice and lead vocals respectively.

Their single 'Hambani Magoduka' went gold within 3½ weeks of release. Their latest single 'Zikha Manzi Ngophondo' looks like it's heading the same way.

PAUL CLINGMAN is a local singer/songwriter whose crossing of indigenous contemporary and traditional sounds with poetic lyrics creates a fascinating musical blend. Paul has been recording for the last 5 years and performing for well over a decade. He will be leaving for Europe at the end of July and his appearances at the Johannesburg Music Festival will be his last live appearances before his departure.

The Paul Clingman band hosts a line-up of well-known names: Ramsey MacKay, founder of Freedom's Children, writer and composer whose recent single "Silent Water" was high on the Radio 5 charts.

Colin Pratley, also a founder member of Freedom's Children will be playing african drums. Colin has made quite a reputation for himself for the skill with which he plays these traditional drums. Colin will perform a solo spot together with Dave Tarr on violin.

Edi Nederlander is the fourth member of the Paul Clingman Band. Edi is noted for her raunchy guitar style and has notched up many successes on campuses throughout the country. Edi has been on the local scene for the past 10 years. For the last five years she has been performing her own compositions solo accoustic. Edi has always been interested in African rhythms, hence the team up with Paul, Ramsey and Colin, who all have the same basic interest in local music.

ROGER LUCEY BAND




ROGER LUCEY started composing songs at the age of 15. He has sung his way around the country and made his home at the popular little folk club – Mangles in Braamfontein.



These three ladies combine to create the magic that is JOY. Their sound is of one, their movement one. JOY swivel and move, strut up high and hug close on mike. Stirring and caressing with harmonies so wild and alive they fasten hold of the soul.

The music of SPIRITS REJOICE is the symbol of the times; a music forged with the alloyed hammers of the times. It hints at rather than is obsessed with ethnicity because it remains true to the tradition of the arts – freedom of expression. The music is polished, warm and future – bound. The group's approach is distinctly intellectual. There are sounds that seem to have been taken from a point beyond our reach. Nonetheless, SPIRITS REJOICE remain functional – they are danceable because they swing and they have a strong sense of humour.

STINGRAY have been together for less than a year, but between them they draw on years of musical experience.

They are six musicians chosen from the finest outfits in South Africa . . . , melded and welded together.

Each member of STINGRAY has spent years working his way through numerous groups and bands, playing all types of music. STINGRAY's roots are in classical music, country rock, rock and roll, metal rock, modern electrical composition . . . STINGRAY's members have developed their craft over the years, both through the live medium and the grinding round of recording and session work.

Between them STINGRAY draw together a dozen or more major influences. It's great talent at work. Six skilled and diverse musicians, with a healthy respect for each other's art and contribution to the whole – this makes for a pretty powerful package. The jokes and camaraderie flow with ease, but the underlying seriousness of what they are about, is never far from the surface



Out of the ashes of South Africa's first punk band, The Fourth Reich, emerged a true guitar hero and teen dream of the new age: Johnny Teen. He went to London, soaked up the blitzkrieg of new wave bands, among them Generation X, The Banshees and The Clash, pogoed back to Durban and formed Wild Youth – the realisation of alternative music here at last. Enter the ideal pin-up Skid Sols on bass and SA's hardest hitting drummer Rubin Rose.

That was a year ago. Wild Youth went on the rampage with an assault of unbelievable stage energy and movement never seen here before. Their searing, electric, rabid, relentless pumping brand of indigenous punk elevated them above cult status and grabbed Sunday newspaper, magazine and other headlines and two tracks on a compilation album of local New Wave music.

They're mesmerising, devastating live. "We're more than punk" they say. They are. And now they're wild in the streets, angry and hungry in their quest for world domination.
