#### Mr. Eden Requests More Railway Jobs For Our People

IT was acknowledged that the Minister of Transport, Mr. B. J. Schoeman, had made a success-J. Schoeman, had made a successful attempt to introduce Coloured persons into the Railway Service. His plea was that the Minister should apply his mind to the question of making more jobs available to Coloureds, to the question of giving better pension benefits to employees, and seeing that generally speaking the travelling conditions for Coloureds were emproved, Mr. Graham Eden said in Parliament.

Instead of paying "mere pit-tances by way of salaries and wages" a very strong group of trained, skilled Coloured person nel could be established, wh would do a first class job and tan asset to the Railways.

Referring annual wages of RA and R455, Mr. Eden said: "it not a wage on which a person of keep body and soul together this country."

Mr. Eden asked the Ministe whether the system obtaining of paying a small, additional wag for what was known as "bette class" work would not be on avenue where the Coloured employees might be paid a little more so that his position might get some status.

Mr. Eden said Coloured travel lers expressed some dissatisfac-tion because first and second clas Coloured passengers were expect ed to use the same waiting room as third-class passengers. The Minister had said that other a commodation was made available where possible. He suggested however, that waiting rooms b provided at the various stations
