Legislative Council. WEDNESDAY, JULY 6, 1836. The Council assembled this day at 12 o'clock when the Municipal Ordinance having been read a second time, the Bill was referred (upon an Amendment moved by the Attorney General and seconded by Mr. van Breda) to an open Sub-Committee, of as many members as could attend, any three to form a Quorum.

CIRCUIT COURT OF WORCESTER (including Clan-Williams). CALENDAR of Criminal Cases, to be tried before the Hon'ble Mr. Justice MENZIES, on the 11th July, 1836.

1. MURDER.—Titus Werwel, of Schildpad-kuil, in the Field-Coronet of Groenokloof, Cape District,—in assaulting upon or about the 29th March last, at a certain place upon the road leading from Tulbagh to Schildpad-kuil, within the District of Worcester,—Sturman, lately in the service of the said Titus Werwel, and then there discharging a gun, loaded with powder and shot, at the said Sturman, and striking and mortally wounding him upon the left breast, in consequence whereof the said Sturman was killed, and thus was murdered by the said Titus Werwel.

2. THE LIKE CRIME.—David, Apprentice Laborer of Andries Jacobus Burger, Agriculturist, residing at Dasseklip, Field Coronet of over the 24 Rivers,—in assaulting upon the 24th December 1835, at Dasseklip aforesaid, Arent lately a Laborer there residing, and with his fist striking the said Arent several blows upon the neck and back, and other parts of his body, and knocking him to the ground, and whilst he was so upon the ground repeatedly kicking and trampling upon the left side, chest, and stomach of the said Arent, in consequence of which injuries so inflicted upon him, the said Arent was killed, and thus murdered by the said David.

CURABLE-HOMESIDE.—William Vloot, laborer, residing at Van Fontein, in the Field-Coronet of Ouder Roggeveld, in assaulting upon or about the 28th April, 1836, at Van Fontein aforesaid, Vloot, lately in the service of Jan Abraham Nel, agriculturist, there residing, and with a stone striking the said Vloot upon the head, and mortally wounding him,—in consequence whereof the said Vloot was killed.—(This case is removed from Clannet.)

3. THEFT.—Aggravated by former conviction of theft.—Louis and Vloot, of profession and place of residence unknown, in stealing upon or about the 20th day of April, 1836, at Middle Post, Field-Coronet of Over the Twenty-four Rivers, one Cow, the property of Paul Mouton, the Younger, Agriculturist, there residing,—the said Louis and Vloot having been heretofore severally convicted of Theft.
