In December 1839, informatic bekomen hebbende van de aankomst deser Negers in de Simonsbaai en dat dezelve werden uitgeleed op grond des Gouvernements, aan personen, om dezelve aankomst te doen, en wachtte tot den 28sten ult. streeks den 26 December 1840, en ontving van den Resident Magistraat zes der negers, met belofte, dat dienstkontrakten aan my zouden worden ter hand gesteld by betaling van 10 shillings per hoofd. Hierop kleedde ik myne negers in de Simonsbaai, en bragt ze in eenen wagen naar myne plaats; hadden, waarmede zy behoortlyk verduurde voortaan, tot den 7 Januarij, toen ik de volgende circulaire ontving:
