CHINA. We have just been favored with a glance of a few Canton papers up to the 23rd of November, from which we ascertain, that in addition to the capture of Chean and Amoy, Chinhae, Tinghae, and Ningpo have also been taken. At Tinghae which was taken on the 1st of October, the Chinese made a determined resistance. As a proof it is stated, so determined was their resistance that the bayonet and spear crossed each other several times; a soldier of the 22d had his bayonet in the body of a Chinese at the moment he received his adversary's spear through his own ribs. Chinhae was captured on the 10th October, after an attack of 3 hours. The Chinese stood well, but the excellent firing of the English ships soon silenced the hill forts. About 600 tons of copper were found in the Arsenal. The Chinese authorities at Ningpo it is supposed, while the English were employed at Chinhae, conveyed away the public treasure, which occupied three days. The treasure from Amoy had also been removed. From the Expedition to the North we find nothing mentioned. We hope to give some extracts in our next.
