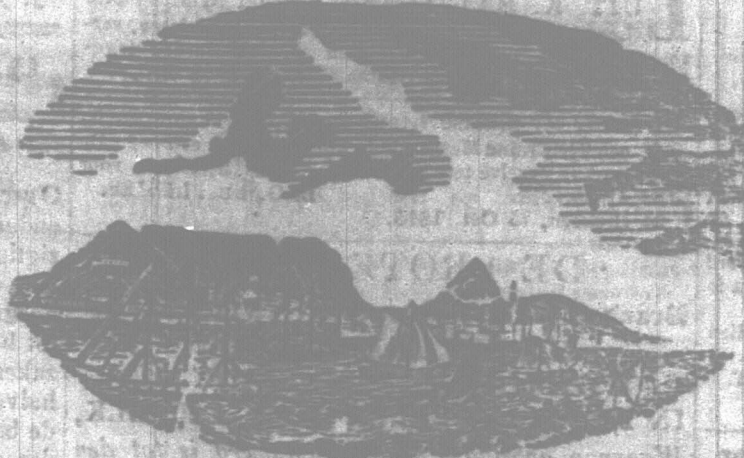

HET DUELLEREN IN FRANKRYK

De Reforms publiceerde het volgende over dat onderwerp: "Er wordt veel gesproken in Algiers betrekkelijk een tweevoudige afname (tot het dood toe) dat binnen kort in deze stad plaats hebben zal, met 'er van den Minister van oorlog, tusschen General Bourgon en Bourjolly, de secondanten van General Klorie van Bourjolly, en General Yusuf (de Arabier) van General Bourjolly. Het gevecht zal te paard geschieden. De troepen zullen eerst pistolen gebruiken, en wanneer deze te vergeefs zijn, zwaabden. Zelfs de grond waarop dit gevecht plaats hebben zal, wordt publiek genoemd. Hoe zullen wy als ministeriel veriof overten brengen met de wet welke het Gouvernement het heeft gegeven krachtadiglyk te handhaven? Reeds de uitmaak van het Koninklyk Hof van Parys, welke inhield dat er geen wetdig misdadig gepleegd was door den Heer Beauvallon die den Heer Dajerier in een tweevoudig gevecht had vernield hebende, deed het Hof van Cassatie niet later dan gisteren weder een soogelyke uitspraak in de zaak van een tweevoudig, welke het Koninklyk Hof van Reunis verklaard had volgens de wet niet te kunnen worden gestraft."

De nieuwbladen melden verder, dat de twist tusschen bovengenoemde officieren reeds twee jaren geleden plaats heeft gehad, maar dat, daaren hunner toen slechts kolonel was, de vyandlykheden tusschen hen opgeschort zyn, tot dat de kolonel bevorderd zoude worden.

THE ZUID-AFRIKAAN

CAPE TOWN, OCTOBER 31, 1845.

ALTHOUGH we always look with great caution upon accounts of the nature of the underfollowing extract, we are yet of opinion, that the facts therein stated possess a sufficient semblance of truth to lead us to the conclusion that the state of affairs beyond the N. E. Boundary is an all but prosperous one; and if the accounts which Government has undoubtedly received in that respect, confirm this information, we trust measures will be at once adopted to convince the Emigrants that Government is really in earnest to carry the preliminary arrangements into effect, and that it will proceed in the matter with the greatest justice: - NORTH EAST BOUNDARY.

(From a Correspondent.)

Orange River, 3d October, 1845. Thank goodness I have once more arrived safe at the colonial side of this river, after an absence of some weeks in the country occupied by the Emigrants, whose masters are say any thing in a prosperous state; in short, I fear evil consequences are likely to arise from the very unsettled state of society. Many of the Caledon River emigrants have trekked further into the interior, and those at Windberg are actually talking of attacking the Griquas to recover the cattle and sheep which have been captured and given over to the Griquas. The state of things is certainly bad, and unless some decisive measures are instantly taken to restore the declining confidence towards the British, depend upon it another military force will be required to take active steps to enforce due obedience. The Emigrants at Windberg say they are determined to have their own laws and form of government, which they are capable of administering themselves, and have memorialized the colonial government to be allowed to do so. They say they will not make any open opposition until all their remonstrances have been declined. And those emigrants residing near the Orange River, who swallowed the oath of allegiance, and promised to behave like good boys in future, and evinced a willingness to pay a trifling quit rent for their farms, and everything else which they had been coaxed to do, are now talking in a very different tone of language; they complain bitterly of the daily thefts of the Griquas, and their arrogant attitude towards them, - no protection whatever granted them; and the Chief Adam Kok says he will enquire into the cases, but the culprits are allowed to go away, and never in one single instance has a case been noticed. Such want of justice and protection has rekindled that animosity formerly existing between the Emigrants and Griquas, and as long we may look for another irruption unless a person is speedily dispatched to settle all the disputes in question. The Griquas are trying every measure to upset the Emigrants' right to farms which they had hired to them, and I heard the Magistrate, who is at Philippolis, has decided several cases in favor of the Emigrants. The uncertain tenure under which the Emigrants hold their farms is another source of complaint; a report has got about that 3,000 morgen in the extent, whereas they hired from the Griquas twice that quantity. And they say if the Government intends taking from them what they have bought from the Griquas, they will consider they have very little justice to expect at the hands of the British Government, and therefore, like many others, will be necessitated to trek further into the interior, and thus avoid all future interference on the part of the Government. With such sentiments and feelings as these, I dread the evil consequences should they attempt the trek, - for land they will and must have to graze their flocks, and consequently will not be when particular as to the mode they obtain it. When at the Modder River, a report had just reached the Emigrants that Masselkats was advancing towards that part of the country, joined by a vast number of Dingans' Zoolas, - that the natives were flying before him in all directions, and the Emigrants at Masselkats were retreating from that part in great panic; - so I may almost say the whole territory between the Orange River and Delagoa Bay is in a blaze, and the Government will have to keep a watchful eye, for the country over the Orange River will ever must be an anxious burden. Nothing less than a host of strong military posts from the Orange River to Port Natal will keep the country in subjection - and such eventually must be done. - C. F. Times, Oct. 23.

(Extract of a letter from Colesberg.)

"The country to the N. E. is said to be in a very unsettled state. A report has been brought into the Colony that the Emigrant Farmers living in and about Moshesh's country are preparing for an attack upon that Chief, doubtless to indemnify themselves for the losses sustained in their late campaign against the Griquas of Philippolis. It is also said that Sinkouyella meditates an attack upon the Farmers, said to be chiefly those who have retired into that part of the country after their defeat at the Zwart Kopjes. A good deal of rain has fallen about the Colesberg District, and the thunder and lightning has been severe. I have heard that a Hottentot boy was killed close to that village by lightning. Much speculation is going on in that part as to the probable fate of the case of the two Messrs. Baillie, concerning which such indelicate and exparte statements were put forth in one of the Frontier papers.

We thank a Correspondent who has been kind enough to point out that we have put an erroneous construction on the extract from the evidence of Mr. Justice Mairas before the Judicial Committee, appearing in our Leading Article of Tuesday last. We think we need hardly say that this has been done most inadvertently; and we gladly avail ourselves of the first opportunity to lay before our readers the following correct extract from the passage in question: "I am also of opinion, without meaning to insinuate that the Grand Jurors have not always acted honestly and conscientiously to the best of their ability, that their decisions have been occasionally influenced by prejudices, naturally, or perhaps necessarily, arising from class and race. It was to this latter part of the evidence that we intended particularly to direct the attention of our readers.

With reference to the letter signed "A Farmer" we are credibly informed that the Civil Commissioner and the Clerk of the Peace of Stellenbosch, started on Monday last, about 4 o'clock p.m., with two armed Police, for the "Houtbosk" to inquire into certain disturbances, occasioned by some free laborers working at the new line of road.

CRIMINAL SESSIONS.

The Criminal Sessions will commence to-morrow, when the following persons will be tried: - Willem Daniels, a laborer, murder; Mary Wallace, a servant, infanticide; Johannes, alias Long Hans, and Hector and the said Hector, the late crimes; August alias Cassien, a carpenter, storebreaking and theft; Joseph Fergo, a servant, housebreaking and theft; Jacob, an laborer, entering by night a brewery, with intent to steal therefrom; Frederick William Bird, a painter, theft; and Johann Adamson, Frederick Rittmuller, a shopkeeper, culpable insanity in contravention of Ordinance No. 6, 1843.

THE WEATHER.

The frontier papers contain several accounts of the heavy fall of rain, accompanied by severe thunder and lightning, which had taken place in the Eastern Districts. A severe loss in cattle and other property had been sustained, but the crops are represented as looking admirably well, and the farmers in high spirits owing to the flourishing accounts of wool.

THE LATE MR. J. H. BAARD.

"In the midst of life we are in death!" - This we also experienced on Friday last, the 24th inst., on the demise of Mr. J. H. BAARD. He died at the advanced age of 63 years, the greatest part whereof had been devoted to the diffusion of the honor of the Saviour. He was the origin of the Missionary Institution in this village, having given the ground upon which the chapel was built in the year 1813. Since that period, and until his death, he remained the faithful promoter of its cause. His loss will be generally felt, but more particularly by the Missionaries of every denomination, who, in his dwelling, always found an hospitable abode.

His remains were carried to the grave on Sunday last, followed by nearly all the inhabitants of the village and environs. - Correspondent.

THE KAFIRS.

Last Thursday a very cruel murder was committed near Post Victoria. The victim was an elderly Hottentot man in the employ of Mr. Price, a trader at that Post. The circumstances of the case, as far as we are informed, are briefly as follows: The deceased was sent to fetch up his master's horses; not returning, as expected, search was made for him, when his body was found bearing the marks of having been strangled and dragged for some distance to the spot where it lay. On careful examination of the ground, the spoor, or naked footmarks of a man was discovered and traced from the spot to a kraal of Kafirs under the Chief Tola. A Report of this being made to him, he at once identified the impression of the foot as being that of a certain Kafir whom he caused to be quickly apprehended. This culprit, it is said, has since confessed to the commission of the crime, and was about to be sent to Graham's Town, for examination by the Resident Magistrate; but whether the jurisdiction of that officer extends to the Ceded Territory, in which the deed was perpetrated, is a point of questionable character.

ADDITIONAL PARTICULARS.

"The victim was an old Hottentot man, employed as cook and house servant by Mr. Price. It appears that some short time ago, the old man had put the Kafir out of his hut, and who threatened that if he ever caught him by himself he would kill him. On the day of the murder Mr. Price sent the poor man to look for his horse, when the Kafir, but too true to his word, seized him and executed his threat. It seems that he knocked him on the head with his klerie (bludgeon), and then left the body until dark, when he drew it to within 200 yards of the post, placing the saddle upon it, but carrying away with him the bridle and stirrup leathers. The murderer is in the guard house here, and has confessed to the commission of the atrocious deed.

ANOTHER FARMER SHOT BY KAFIRS.

The following distressing intelligence is contained in a letter before us of the 13th instant: - "The Kafirs having stolen four horses in the 'Dry Spruit' of the Konop, belonging to Hendrik van Vuuren, five farmers went off in pursuit. The murderers on being closely pursued, finding that one horse was retreating, shot the animal dead, and then concealed themselves in a deep gully. On the farmers coming up to the spot, they fired on them, and unfortunately struck Van Vuuren. The firing was returned, and kept up by the farmers until they heard no more. They then brought away their wounded companion, and espined two horses, the Kafirs, however, getting off with the other three. All these Kafirs are stated to have been armed with guns. The sound of Van Vuuren's very dangerous. The ball entered just below the elbow, took a direction upwards, passed through the large muscle, and came out just below the socket of the shoulder, shattering and carrying away the arm bone." At the time the foregoing was written, the father

of the wounded man was at Ft. Beaufort in a state of the most pitiable distress.

TWO KAFIRS SHOT.

The same communication which contains the above, states that two Kafirs, who had stolen some cattle from the Fieldcornet De Lange, and were pursued, being overtaken near the Winterberg, were both shot by the pursuing party. (It is added that 26 head of cattle, the property of De Lange, have been carried off since this fatal affray.

Original Correspondence.

"Some atrocious acts having been committed on the Public Road near Howwood, originating from the effects of the Customs being situated there, the Farmers should be cautious not to pass that road on Saturday nights, when the laborers receive their pay, unless they are well prepared to oppose an assault. A FARMER.

"It is said and much talked about, that a marriage was lately solemnized between a widower and his deceased wife's sister, three children having been procured by his first wife; and it was asked, whether it was legal, and if so, whether the last marriage Ordinance made it legal, it being well known that formerly such marriages were not to be allowed; consequently illegal, unless with consent of Government in the year 1798 consent having been obtained from Government by Mr. John Elmille to marry his wife's sister, a similar application was made in December, 1841, in behalf of Miss E. Perkins to marry James Harrison, who had been married to her sister, when Lord Charles Somerset's answer was, 'upon a reference to the cases you have quoted as precedents, which might be followed with the view of setting aside the Colonial Law in your peculiar case, I find that the cases of John Elmille and J. C. Antonissen, both occurred during the Dutch Government here, and during the period that Holland was under the influence of the Revolutionary Government, and under that restriction the matrimonial laws were abolished. Under these circumstances I regret to say, it is quite out of my power to sanction the proposed marriage.'

Now, I may say, will the present Government, not being under the influence of a Revolutionary Government, pass this act unanodiced? I may also add, that if the Magistrate's query to the bridegroom, 'whether he was related to his spouse and in what degree?' and whether a Deed of Kinderbewijs was effected?' had been properly answered, he would have passed before he had passed the License. I hope that you, Sir, will not pass by this circumstance without noticing it for the benefit of the public, and thereby prevent a recurrence of such acts. QUID.
