require time, and the expenditure of much blood and treasure.

We hope the rumour is incorrect; that accounts are to be sent from this country. His Excellency must perceive that we have no soldiers to spare for such work. There are already a sufficient number of men on the spot to defend the few settlers that remain, and all the troops in these colonies would prove insufficient to prosecute with success an offensive war. Let measures be taken for the protection of the emigrants residing at the various settlements, but before engaging in an aggressive conflict, the authorities should wait for orders, as well as reinforcements, from England.

Having stated the loss of the British, the Lieutenant-Governor communicates the following:-

A chief from Waka's party (it being their custom to send a chief to communicate with another chief) of Heki's pah, where he was received with hospitality. On enquiring the number of their dead and wounded, they said they could form no idea, but chiefly Kowiti's men; they declared their own numbers to be very small, seven only being shot when actually in the pah; they were then asked if two hundred would cover the number to which they again replied, it was impossible to tell. Kowiti appears being too old a man to run, had, during the second charge, secreted himself under the dead body of one of his band, and thus saved his own life, deceiving those who must in the heat of the charge have trampled him under foot; this is to be much wondered at, as no quarter was shown to the wounded on the field, the men being shot, or otherwise despatched, as those who fell in their way, having had orders to this effect previously in consequence of the driving custom of their wounded raising themselves up after being passed and fired on the rear of their pursuers, which was once or twice attempted but with no success, as they were immediately destroyed. This is the second time I am told, Kowiti has saved himself in this manner. By this chief Heki sent a message to us to say that our dead had been picked up, and that they should have a christian burial, and the service read over them. Kowiti was compelled to retreat with the loss of seven or eight, in fact, all his chiefs, two of whom were his own sons. It appears that some of Kowiti's and Heki's men wanted to strip our dead of their clothing, (the soldiers' red jackets being much coveted), and to divide the spoil among them; but Heki would not permit this, and insisted on the alphas being either buried with their bodies or burned. This, like other of his former deeds, was undoubtedly an honourable trait in the character of the hero Hoki.
