ALL those interested in the welfare of the Colony, and especially the Wine Growers, will perceive from a notice in our advertising columns, that a Public Meeting of Wine Growers and others will be held in the Court Room, at Stellenbosch, on Wednesday the 28th instant...

A more barefaced, or more absurd petition, we believe, has never met the public eye, and we therefore proceed to follow it up step by step. In the first place the petitioners state that for the purposes of their trade, they have been obliged to expend a large capital in the erection of warehouses, the purchase of staves, casks, &c., and above all BRANDY; and that by the sudden and unexpected promulgation of the order in Council, raising the duty from 4d. to 1s. per gallon, they have been greatly injured.

Do they conceive that the Home Government will adopt their views, when they are pleased to say that in three years 247,222 gallons of foreign Brandy have been imported, whilst in the same period the Colony, (mind, previous to this period little or no Spirit was distilled in the Colony) only produced 44,716 gallons; and that because this quantity is considered insufficient for home consumption, the duty ought to be repealed.

The petitioners state, that a prejudice against wine prepared with Cape Manufactured Spirit exists in the home market. This, however, we consider to be mere affectation on their part; for we honestly believe they cannot prove this to have taken place in any one instance; and that, even if such a prejudice did exist, it must have arisen from mistaking the admixture of Spanish or Naples Brandy for that of Cape made Spirit.
