THE ZUID-AFRIKAAN.

CAPE TOWN, MAY 21, 1846.

In compliance with the generally expressed wish we lay before our readers in this number the whole of the proceedings of our Municipal Body and the Local Government, relative to the levies in Cape Town, in pursuance of Ordinance No. 20, 1846.

We purposely abstain however from any remarks, with reference to these proceedings, considering it most expedient that every one should calmly read and judge for himself in a matter which has caused the greatest excitement perhaps ever before witnessed among the inhabitants of this Town.

TOWN HALL, FRIDAY, MAY 1, 1846.
Special Meeting of the Commissioners for the Municipality of Cape Town.

Present—All the Commissioners.

The Commissioners having returned the several lists put in their hands by resolution of the Board of yesterday,

It was moved by Commissioner Wicht, seconded by Commissioner Van Reenen, and resolved, that the Secretary be instructed in framing the lists, to insert such remarks only, as have reference to bodily infirmity, which lists shall submit for the consideration of the Board before being transmitted.

Further resolved, that all persons having passed their 30th year, shall be considered as belonging to the second column of between 30 and 45. And all such having passed their 45th year, as belonging to the third column between the ages of 45 and 50 years.

Extract from the Minutes of an ordinary Meeting of the Commissioners for the Municipality of Cape Town, held on Wednesday the 6th May 1846.

Present:—Commissioners Smuts, (Chairman), Kunhardt, Jarvis, Stone, Wentzel, Hofmeyr and Brink.

Read a letter from the Secretary to Government of the 6th instant [see appendix No. 4], and of Mr. J. le Sueur, of the same date [see appendix No. 5], the first communicating to the Commissioners the appointment of the latter as Deputy Civil Commissioner, the latter informing the Board of his appointment.—Resolved, that these letters be recorded.

The Secretary having then submitted the lists, as framed from the returns of the Wardmasters, It was moved by Commissioner Jarvis, seconded by Commissioner Kunhardt, that the list be headed "Return of unmarried male inhabitants of the Municipality of Cape Town, between the ages of 16 and 60 years," upon which it was moved as a further amendment by Commissioner Hofmeyr, "that the remarks shall also be stated, as regards his district, those whom he considers incapable."

This last amendment not being seconded, was not put. The votes being then taken up on the amendment, Commissioners Wentzel, Hofmeyr, Brink and Kunhardt voted for it, and Commissioners Van Reenen, Jarvis, Stone, Wentzel and Brink against the same.

There being a majority of votes for the motion, the Chairman declared the same to be carried, and it was resolved accordingly.

SATURDAY, MAY 2nd 1846.
Present,—All the Commissioners.

Read a letter from the Secretary to Government, dated 1st May, [see Appendix No. 2] acknowledging their receipt of the letter of the Commissioners, testifying their assistance, as stated in the Draft approved of at the meeting of yesterday, and with reference to which letter he conveys in the name of His Excellency the thanks of the Governor for the ready and handsome manner in which they have come forward to tender such assistance.—Resolved, that the said letter be recorded.

The Chairman then submitted a note [see Appendix No. 3] which he received from the Secretary to Government this morning, requesting him, accompanied by a deputation, to meet him at the Colonial Office, as soon as possible, to have a conference for adopting measures to give effect in Cape Town to His Excellency's Proclamation—extending Martial Law throughout the Colony. In consequence of which note, he accompanied by Commissioners Jarvis, Wicht and Kunhardt, waited upon the Secretary to Government, who communicated to them the commands of His Excellency the Governor to levy a force from the inhabitants of Cape Town, and a sum double existed in how far the Cape Town and Green Point Municipalities could be considered as belonging to the Cape Division, to introduce into the Legislative Council an Ordinance for removing such doubt, and for making provisions to regulate the levy of the burgher force of Cape Town and Green Point, and requested the deputation would submit for the consideration of the Board of Commissioners, whether it would be preferable to appoint the Civil Commissioner of the Cape Division the summoning officer or the Chairman of the Board with the power so to be recorded.

Upon which it was unanimously resolved,—that it be suggested to the Honorable the Secretary to Government, that the Wardmasters of the Cape Town Municipality be placed as regards the Secretary to the Municipality, and for the services required under the existing circumstances, in the same relation as the Fieldcornets are to the Civil Commissioners of their respective divisions; that the Secretary to the Municipality be authorized to call for any return from said Wardmasters for the above purpose;—and in case any ward orwards be not represented, to appoint any person or persons as Special Wardmaster or Wardmasters for the same purpose; and in the event of any services being required from the Municipality, that the Hon'ble the Secretary to Government shall give notice thereof to the Secretary of the Municipality—upon which the latter shall forthwith call upon such persons as may be deemed fit for executing such service, and draw a list of such persons to the Hon'ble the Secretary to Government; and in case of refusal or neglect to attend when summoned, the Secretary to the Municipality be authorized to prosecute.

Further resolved, that a joint Meeting of Commissioners and Wardmasters, be held this afternoon at 3 o'clock, to take the above resolution into consideration.

SATURDAY, 2d MAY, 1846, 3 o'CLOCK, P.M.
Special and Joint Meeting of the Commissioners and Wardmasters for the Municipality of Cape Town.

Wardmaster Gie in the Chair.

The Proceedings of the Board of Commissioners of this morning, concluding this meeting, having been read, Commissioner Jarvis, at the request of the Chairman to the Board of Commissioners, explained, that the deputation mentioned in the said proceedings, having waited upon the Secretary to Government, with an extract of the resolution adopted by the Commissioners, he informed them that the Government could not adopt the proposal of the Commissioners, and had determined to appoint the Civil Commissioner for the Cape Division the summoning officer for the Municipalities of Cape Town and Green Point, and that the Wardmasters would be placed in regard to that officer in the same relation as the Fieldcornets of their respective divisions, authorizing the Commissioners for the Municipality, to appoint such number of Special Wardmasters, as may be deemed necessary, and that an Ordinance to that effect would be submitted to the Council at 3 o'clock this day.

In consequence of which statement it was moved by Commissioner Jarvis, seconded by Wardmaster Borgstrom, it being presumed that the Ordinance would pass, that the several Wardmasters proceed without delay to take a census of the inhabitants of their respective wards.

This reply having been laid before the Board of Commissioners in their ordinary meeting the same day, it was resolved to submit it forthwith for the consideration of a joint meeting of Commissioners and Wardmasters.

At this meeting, held yesterday afternoon at 4 o'clock, and numerously attended not only by the Commissioners and Wardmasters, but also by a large number of inhabitants, the inexpediency and injustice of such a measure on the part of Government was most emphatically demonstrated by several speakers, and amongst others it was asserted, that before the passing of the Ordinance the Attorney General had assured the Commissioners that Government had no intention to bring a single married person in the ballot, before the March of the unmarried classes were exhausted.

The meeting were also unanimously of opinion, that, even putting aside the inexpediency and injustice of the intended measure, and the individual cases of extreme distress which would inevitably result therefrom, the Government had no right to insist on a further levy, as the Municipality had already furnished much more than the required complement of 800, in the 418 drawn, the Malays and other volunteers, and the liberated African Corps, which is now being organized, all of which latter should have been included in the ballot. It was therefore resolved to request the Government to put a stop to any further levy, which resolution was carried by loud and deafening acclamation.

The late hour at which this boisterous meeting was concluded, prevents us from offering any remarks; but we may be allowed merely to add our sincere hope, that His Excellency the Governor, in whose name and on whose authority the Government is now carried on here, will see the imperative necessity, by consenting to the present proposal, of putting an end to the excitement by which our town has been disturbed during the last few days.

Not knowing to what extremes Government may yet proceed, in spite of the strongest remonstrances, we beg to refer our readers to an advertisement, inserted in our advertising columns, of an association lately formed for PROCURING SUBSTITUTES. The sum required from each subscriber is only Three Pounds, the Society undertaking to provide a Substitute in case the Subscriber be drawn to serve in the burgher force of Cape Town. Entirely concurring in the utility of such an institution,—as a precautionary measure—we advise our fellow townsmen to lose no time in entering their names, as by such a step a sufficient amount will not only be raised to find a number of efficient Substitutes, but a great deal of anxiety will be thrown off their minds.
