







POSTSCRIPT

MONDAY MORNING.

The Frontier Post of Saturday Evening last, brought no news whatever from Block Drift, the present scene of negotiation. The only particulars are the following:—

Monday.—A shocking murder was wantonly and publicly committed in High-street, Graham's Town, yesterday evening. This murderer is a young Hottentot in the employ of Mr. Ogilvie. The man, it seems, was standing in the street with his gun loaded, and was speaking to two Hottentot girls, who were in charge of two little children belonging to Mr. E. Phillips, to one of whom he made a proposal, which he was declining to accept, he levelled his gun and threatened to shoot her. The children on seeing him raise his gun, immediately ran off—the elder one, a boy of about four years of age, leading the younger. The man fired, and the ball passing through the shoulder of one of the girls, who was killed on the spot, struck the other, who, after lingering a short time, also expired. The man is in custody... From Col. Somerset's camp there is news up to yesterday, on which day Umbaba arrived with some of his followers. Of the object of his visit we are not informed.

On Friday a Hottentot was brutally murdered by Kaffir near Fort Beaufort. The unfortunate man was herding cattle, and whilst in this occupation he appears to have been seized and tied, and brutally stabbed to death. Some of the cattle were driven off by the authors of this barbarous outrage.

We are sorry to find that the report about the resignation of Sir Andries Stockenström is confirmed.
