THE COMMANDO CLAIMS.

To His Excellency Sir Harry Smith. — I thought your Excellency said you would not quail to public opinion? But you have! I told you the Duffie Jacket would never submit to your Militia Bill. They came about you strong eh? You had no idea Myhrer would show his teeth so awfully! Ah! my respected Governor, you must begin to see that things have changed in the colony since you were here before. The Boers are not to be bamboozled by soft-sounding politicians, neither will they kneel down to Lord Charles Somerset, or any sort of military despotism. They begin to think for themselves, and having made up their minds on any subject, be they right or they wrong, they will require more than your Excellency's power of persuasion to alter their opinions. When your Excellency rises to make speeches, if you value your own character, do abstain from threats and uncomfortable hints as to your own power, and the inability of your opposition to it. People do not like to be constantly reminded of their degradation. It is enough to wear fetters, without having our pockets searched by a passing Cavalryman. There is no occasion to add insult to injury. We are not all men of Pipe-clay. We are not soldiers to be drilled, and lectured, and marched right and left, and dismissed with a — Civility costs nothing; and it is far cheaper and more wearing commodity than the undignified familiarity with persons of all kinds and stations in life, and of all shades of character. Some of the late petitions prayed for a civil Governor, not as opposed to the military, but as a Governor, who would exercise discretion in withdrawing the Militia Bill. Had you consulted those who could have advised you on that subject without any detriment to your own independence, you would not have embarked on that troubled sea, yet foaming with the tempestuous agonies of the last commando and the compensation claims. You have lost more ground by that movement than you imagine, but you may yet recover yourself by discharging the commando claims against the Government. If you will not give us anything for our personal services, and for our losses of horses and baggage, which His M. Dragon Guards (paid soldiers), got paid for in the said war, pay at all events the unfortunate country people, whose sole means of subsistence viz, their cattle and their wagons, were forced from them, and afterwards, such as remained, sold for the benefit of the Government! Pay the poor devils their money, and do not let the reproach rest on that Government, which is now your Excellency's. Your Excellency has nothing to do with that. I allow, but you must admit its validity, and if you had your own way, every one knows you would soon do the correct thing. We see the difficulties of your position, and the risk of disapprobation you must run if such charges are sent in to the Home Treasury; but your sense of justice and moral courage will support you through the trial. Remember your duty to the colony of all shades. You are a kind-hearted, generous man; I all honor you for your private worth; let us write your name, as we have Sir Benjamin's in the tablets of our memories, as a just and humane Governor. Remember that the farmers are now in a disastrous condition. They are nearly all ruined by the price of labour, the road tax, and the enormous tolls they have to pay. The fall of these things is ruinous. Some farmers have no more than a few shillings left, and their wives may be the cause, the pressure on the agriculturists is terrible just now. The fact is inevitable; the cause may be a matter of controversy, and I shall not plunge into that. The remedy lies in a great measure, with your Excellency. Settle the Commando Claims without any more hanging of committees, in forenoon, and draw upon the English Treasury for the amount. I pray your Excellency to let Sir Harry pay the money, as he will do so to your credit than all the after dinner platitudes of proxy and parenthetical plavers, sitting as it were in banco; or the deluge of butter churned for your acceptance by a "forty-parson power". I am afraid our stomachs are getting acquainted with all the gross names we have had to swallow at our public banquets of late. Your "Immortal Dulles" won't go down more than once, and what may be a lapsus lingue in a moment, will be considered justing not convenient in a chief justice!

Do not forget to let us know when the new constitution is to be opened upon: we must have time to prepare for the change, and to accommodate the new system to our old habits. Lord Grey will carry out your Excellency's views as far as he can, and perhaps altogether, for it will scarcely occur to him that the Colonists are ignorant of your propositions.

Of one thing you may be quite sure, which is, that the colonists will jump at any change in the present constitution of the Legislative Council. The new craft may steer wildly at first, but will eventually find her right trim, and we will prefer her lively movements to the water-logged lumber of the present unseaworthy old tub. Some wise men shake their heads and prognosticate all sorts of confusion and disasters; but we are in as healthy a state as any community can be for a change in our form of Government. We have no Socialists, Communists, or Red Republicans, and the party feeling between English and Dutch is not universal, or so strong, as to bind both parties to the merits or demerits of their future candidates for political honors. No! no! — no fear of it. It is only one of the weak inventions of the enemy. Before I close this letter, allow me to whisper in your Excellency's ear that the public have an eye to your Excellency's distribution of patronage, and the increasing expenditure of the public money in new appointments, some of which are known to be unnecessary, and others to be filled with incompetent parties; viz. Surveyor General's office, *basim*. Your Excellency appears to be carried a little too far by feelings of private friendship, and the public advantage and the public security seem to be secondary considerations to the family reunion of those who constitute your body guard! You understand me. If it things go on in this way there will be row about it. You, Sir Harry, have a touch of Prince Harry in you. When the Prince became King he did not make Falstaff a C. B., nor Pistol chamberlain of his household, nor Pious lord chancellor. He was willing to help an old friend in need, but not at the expense of public morals, or the public service. His charity was not exercised towards unseaworthy objects, at the cost of his other subjects, a faithful, and perhaps more meritorious, though not so important. But what he did do, you will find in Shakespeare's play of Henry IV., Part II., Act V., — where the new King thus addresses Falstaff and his clique: —

"I banish thee on pain of death, As I have done the rest of my misleaders, Not to come near our person by ten miles; For competence of life I will allow you, That lack of means excuse you not to evil, And as we hear you do reform yourselves, We will accord you to your strength and qualities, Give you advancement."
