Anti-Convict Association.

A Meeting of the Association held in the Town Hall, This Day, Tuesday, Revd. GEORGE MORGAN in the Chair. It was Moved by J. A. Merrington, Esq., Seconded by Thos. Sutherland, Esq., And carried unanimously. That this Meeting has heard with deep regret of the barbarous and cruel assault made upon the Person and Property of JOHN FAIRBANKS, Esq., last night, and would recognize the protection of Providence in preserving his life in the circumstances of peril to which he was then exposed; and this Meeting declares its opinion that throughout the arduous and painful struggle in which Mr. F. has been for some time engaged in seeking to relieve this Colony from one of the greatest evils with which it has ever been threatened, he has manifested the same magnanimity and firmness which characterized his conduct when he achieved the Liberty of the Press; and this Colony, though opposed by a despotic and powerful Government; and with reference to the present struggle, they declare it to be their opinion, that if Mr. FAIRBANKS's example has been more closely followed, the peace of the Town and Colony would not have been disturbed for a single hour.
