That this Association wishes to convey to the Anti-Convict Associations throughout the Colony an expression of the pleasure and satisfaction with which they have received, from time to time, "Copies of their Votes and Proceedings," which meet with their entire concurrence, and also to return their hearty thanks for the approval of their own proceedings voted and made public by the said Associations.—Carried unanimously.
