













This post. Though the Great Lake then would not itself seem likely to lead to very important results (further than that its neighbourhood seems well supplied with ivory.) the river system connected with it opens up the High way into Central Africa, where a magnificent field of enterprise and discovery awaits the scientific traveller or daring sportsman. It is ascertained from various and concurring sources, that not far beyond the chief Ra Sabotano, who resides near where the waters of the mountains divide north and south, there are several rivers running northward, his head quarters being on the Tamslikan which runs northward; that a large river system, exists in the country beyond Sabotano's eventually running eastwards, as evidenced by the following facts. The Griqua hunters who have been in Ra Sabotano's neighbourhood, state that there are large rivers running northward, a little beyond Ra Sabotano. The subjects of the chief Moselekate state, that their chief applied to a nation living on a large river no toward of him to ferry him across in his boats, as the river could not be otherwise crossed, he being anxious to escape further westward from the attacks of the Mashona, a tribe to the north east of him, using large and powerful spears, no were so powerful for the Lions of the North; that the river tribes had laughed at him, and would not cross him over, saying he would betray them. Both the tribes to the north-east of the Mashona, and to the north west of the river tribes possess game. Further, that some of the emigrant Boers who accompanied the expedition against Moselekate last year, state that after leaving the Limpopo, they proceeded northward up a dry river named the Shek, crossed the mountains where the waters divided north and south, and proceeding further north attacked Moselekate on a river running northwards, about as large as the Marique, and evidently a tributary. The country occupied by Moselekate is said to be a splendid country for cattle, therefore probably healthy; is well wooded and exceedingly mountainous; there seems great probability that our restless neighbours over the Vaal, will ere long pass themselves off, as they did fifty years ago of that now occupied by them. It is stated that some of them have already penetrated nearly as far as Sofala. What a boundless field of enterprise does this neglected continent open up. We trust the example of our friend Mr. Cumming will rouse some of the hardy and daring youth of Britain to follow in the same track, until one great central highway is opened up from the mountains of Ra Sabotano to the sources of the Nile; and "unexplored territory," no longer disgraces the map of Africa.

Mr. O'well was hunting on the Bottle when last heard of, not being able to proceed for want of an interpreter. He is shortly expected out, when we trust he will furnish the public with an account of his expedition, which cannot fail to be interesting.

Change has taken place in our position, with regard to our Kafir neighbours. Moshesh has not redelivered the cattle stolen from Moroko, and further thefts are said to have taken place within the border. It is high time that something were done to put a stop to this unassailable state of affairs, which has already existed too long.—*Blomfontein Gazette*, Nov. 18.
