ON THE GRAND PARADE. The following Prizes will be given by the CAPE OF GOOD HOPE AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY, at their Cattle Show to be held on WEDNESDAY, the 21st September, 1853. 1. For the best Colt, thoroughbred, 3 years old, £10 0 0 2. For the best Filly, thoroughbred, 3 years old, 5 0 0 N.B. - The Pedigree to be verified by the Breeder's Stud Book (if required).

3. For the best entire Horse or Gelding, adapted for the saddle, from 3 to 5 years old, 5 0 0 4. For the best pair of Carriage Horses, either entire or geldings, from 3 to 5 years old, 5 0 0 5. For the best imported Bull of a milking breed, 5 0 0 6. For the best Colonial-bred Bull of a milking breed, 5 0 0 7. For the best Cow in Milk, 5 0 0 8. For the best Heifer, 2 years old, 3 0 0 9. For the best Slaughter Ox, 10 0 0 10. For the best Merino Ram, either Colonial bred or imported, combining size and symmetry of carcass with close wool of a fine combing quality, a Cup of 5 0 0 11. For the best Merino Ram, either imported or Colonial bred, showing closest and finest wool of clothing quality, a Cup of 5 0 0 (The Rams sent to compete for the above two Prizes to show at least four permanent teeth, and the Competitor to produce a Certificate that the growth of the wool does not exceed twelve months.)

12. For the best pen of not less than 3 slaughter wethers, of any breed, 2 0 0 13. For the best Boar, 2 0 0 14. For the best Pig for slaughter, 2 0 0 15. Wool Prizes of £30 and £15.

THE Cape of Good Hope Agricultural Society, with a view to call the attention of the London Wool Brokers to a fair sample of the best Wools which this Colony can produce, and for the encouragement of those Wool Growers who pay due attention to the washing, sorting, and general preparation of their respective clips for the English Market, have determined to offer two Wool Prizes on the following terms, viz.: - 1. Each Competitor to bring forward not less than 1,600 lbs. Dutch weight, bona fide from his own clip of the present Season, 1853.

2. The same to be delivered in Cape Town in November, if possible, or at the latest by the 1st of December, so as to admit of the whole consignment being sent to England by the Mail Steamer of December, in time for the February Sales of 1854. 3. All the Wools so dispatched will be sold by public auction, at one and the same sale in February 1854, and the lot of 1,600 lbs. which obtains the highest average price, will be entitled to the first prize of £30, and the next to the second prize of £15.

4. The whole consignment will be shipped for England by one Mercantile House in Cape Town, to be chosen by vote of the Competitors. 5. In order to prevent a fictitious value being attached to any particular lot, or lots, by friendly bidders at the public sale, or otherwise, it is requested that each Competitor will send his Wool to his own Agent in Cape Town, each bale labelled with his own mark. The bales will be handed over immediately in that state to the Shipping Agent, with whom will be associated some Member of the Agricultural Society as a confidential Committee. For the purpose of removing the private marks of the Competitors, and substituting some other marks, a private record of which will be kept by the Committee, and not divulged to any person whatever.

Thus each lot will have its own distinguishing mark which cannot be recognized by any parties in E. land, and when the result of the sale is forwarded to the Cape, full accounts of the same, together with the Brokers' remarks, will be published for general information. 6. "HOPEFIELD,"

A new Village (thus named in honour of the Hon'ble Messrs. HORS and FRIZZ.) together with a Church to be founded near SALDANHA BAY.

In the Fieldcorner of Saldanha Bay, Division of Malmesbury, on the Farm of DIJK JOHANNES VISSER, Esq situated at Salt River, called "LANGE KUIL."

The Government having approved of the establishment of a Village, called "HOPEFIELD," at the above place, and the Tullagh Presbytery of the Dutch Reformed Church having established a separate congregation there.
