His Excellency THE GOVERNOR AT MOSSEL BAY.—The following address was presented to His Excellency the Governor, by the Inhabitants of Mossel Bay:— MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.—The Inhabitants of this place are glad to meet your Excellency, and they highly appreciate your Excellency's wishes to make yourself personally acquainted with the locality, and the wants of each district...

To attain this object it will, however, be necessary that this harbor be brought in direct communication with the back country, and especially with the important division of Beaufort.

By the opening of the mountain Pass, which now forms the sole barrier, the advantages will only be secured, inasmuch as that gigantic work, "the Montagu Pass," a work which for many an age will do credit to the able civil servant whose name so justly has been given to it; and by the increase of commerce resulting therefrom such works might be constructed in the bay, as will tend not only to render it of the greatest colonial utility, but as will make this port one of the safest Harbours of Refuge for the navigation in general.

The Inhabitants hope that such works as alluded to will be undertaken under your Excellency's Government, and that in general, your Excellency's administration may be a period signalized by the advance of the moral and physical welfare of the colony, and that peace on the frontier may not be disturbed. Should, however, this unfortunately be the case, then the Inhabitants of this place assure your Excellency of their wishes to co-operate with your Excellency in such measures as may serve to make the colony respected by the numerous tribes on our borders.

I have also to return my thanks to you for the wishes you have expressed for the success of my administration, but I particularly thank you for your offer of co-operation in such measures as may be necessary to make the colony respected by the numerous tribes upon our borders. I think it is probable that nothing would more tend to produce peace and tranquillity, and to prevent future out-breaks on the part of the native races, than their being aware that the Inhabitants of this Colony generally were determined by all the means at their disposal, to aid the Government on every occasion in its efforts to repress acts of violence, and to promote peace.

The following address was handed over by the Rev. Mr. de Riet:— To His Excellency Sir George Grey, K.C.B., Governor of the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope, &c. &c. Sir,—In the name of the Consistory of the Dutch Reformed Church (Church of Mossel Bay), I desire to express our sincere joy at your Excellency's safe arrival in this parish with Lady Grey, after a tedious journey through a barren country. Your Excellency will now be able to know by experience some of the difficulties we have to contend with in promoting the religious and intellectual advancement of our flocks. A poor, and for a long time neglected, population, scattered thinly over a wide expanse of country, between rocky glebes and impassable mountains, must suggest to your Excellency how extremely difficult it must be to assemble children in schools, and their parents with themselves in churches. And hence your Excellency might easily infer that it is not an easy task to sustain our school and church establishments in small villages like this. Whilst we therefore gratefully acknowledge the aid we have hitherto received from the Colonial Government, we would refer your Excellency to some of our memorials addressed to your Excellency's predecessors by the Consistory of this Church, and take this opportunity to represent the dangerous tendency of any experiment that might be made to introduce the Voluntary System into this colony.

Wishing your Excellency and Lady Grey an agreeable and satisfactory tour, and praying that it might please the Governor of all the Earth to cause your Excellency to return in health and safety.

Sir,—I am directed by His Excellency the Governor, to acknowledge the receipt of your address, presented in the name of the Consistory of the Dutch Reformed Church of Mossel Bay, dated the 9th instant, and to thank you for your expression of pleasure at Lady Grey's and his own arrival in this part of South Africa. MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.—We, the undersigned, Commissioners of the Municipality and inhabitants of the village of Riversdale, beg to congratulate your Excellency on your appointment as Governor of this Colony, and beg to welcome you and Lady Grey on your safe arrival in our village, on your journey to the Eastern Frontier.

Aware of the very great success which has attended your Excellency's administration in New Zealand, particularly in the management of the native tribes, we feel confident that your experience will enable you to adopt such measures as will shortly allay the present excitement on the frontier of this colony, and tend to the establishment of permanent peace with the native tribes of Southern Africa, and their advancement in civilization.

Knowing that it is your Excellency's desire, during your present journey through the colony, to make yourself acquainted with the several wants and requirements of the different districts, we would humbly beg to bring to your Excellency's notice the necessity of having this important district of Riversdale converted into a separate division, with its own Civil Commissioner, it being by far the largest and most populous district of this colony, not being a Civil Commissioner, and the inconvenience, expense and loss of time incurred by the inhabitants, in having to proceed to the village of Swellendam to pay their Government dues, and transact other official business is considerable, the remote parts of this district being at least 150 miles from the village of Swellendam, the seat of the present Civil Commissioner.

In conclusion, we wish your Excellency and Lady Grey a safe and prosperous journey, and have the honor to subscribe ourselves your Excellency's most obedient, humble servants. Riversdale, 6th January, 1855.

GENTLEMEN.—Upon Lady Grey's part and my own I return you my most sincere thanks for the arrival of welcome with which you have greeted our arrival here, and for the wishes you have expressed for our safe and prosperous journey through the colony. You may rely upon my conforming to the wishes you have expressed in your address, that I should exert myself to devise measures which may fortunately tend to the establishment of permanent peace with the native tribes of South Africa, and their advancement in civilization. To attempt to accomplish such great and desirable objects shall ever be my earnest care.
