The late D'Urban meeting of the Koeberg farmers and others is a good preliminary to Parliamentary discussion on three very important subjects. Such meetings ought to be held in every district throughout the colony, and the proceedings published in the papers for the information of those whom it may concern. The collective wisdom of Parliament, though as a whole very respectable, might yet borrow a few rays of light from such sources, and would be in a position to form a correct opinion of the public mind, in different parts of the Colony, with regard to those important matters, that must come under discussion in the course of next session.

The most eligible means of defending our frontier has been all along, and will be for some time to come, a question beset with many difficulties. It would be unreasonable to expect to see the problem solved by such a meeting as that of D'Urban, but that does not prove that there may not have been made some valuable suggestions, at desire to come under consideration in the larger field and place.

In reference to the proceedings of the meeting in general, it is clear that the people knew what they were about when they called Mr. VAN DER SPUY to the chair. He deserved their confidence and proved it at once, by deferring the reading of a letter from a Member of Parliament, on the chief subject of the meeting, because they had met to express their own opinions.

The resolution on the subject of the burgher-law is sound enough in principle, but enters too much into detail. It runs thus: That it is both needful and prudent that provision should be made for the safety of the country, and it is but fair that those who cannot perform burgher service should contribute towards a commando fund, by imposing a tax of ten shillings upon every head without distinction, and should the same not be sufficient, that it be increased to twenty shillings."

The only part of this resolution that we find fault with is, that it fixes the amount of the tax contemplated in furtherance of the object. That amount ought perhaps to be different in the different districts, but at any rate there is no harm in the suggestion, and the proposal of 10s. a head, to be doubled if necessary, does not show a negligible spirit. On one point all agree, "that it is needful that provision should be made for the safety of the country"; the difference is as to the means. The questions for consideration are such as these: Is there a sufficient number of fighting men among the residents on or near the frontier, to repel such attacks as we are from time to time exposed to, and if not, how must we supply the deficiency? We consider the suggestion of contributing to a commando fund a very important onus of life and loss of property are insuperable from war, and the braver the defenders of the country, the greater is the chance of their having wives and orphans to provide for. But this fund, besides giving compensation of losses and providing for the destitute, might serve another important purpose. There may be classes of men within the colony who are so situated, that they would not object to enlist as substitutes for others, if they were paid for their services. These would of course form a corps by themselves, and act under the orders of burghers to be placed over them as officers. If, as in former wars, burghers and military must combine, it is desirable that, while they act in concert, the officer in command of the military should not be placed over the head of the commander of the burgh force. Two distinct bodies can act in concert, without being subordinate the one to the other. We know that such an arrangement would be an anomaly, which it is desirable to avoid; but under peculiar circumstances very peculiar arrangements may become necessary. With regard to imposing active service on the inhabitants of the Western Province, we perfectly agree with one of the speakers at the D'Urban meeting, that this has been done before, and that the result was not of a nature to encourage us to renew the measure. Let the people from the west contribute handsomely to the commando fund, but do not expect them to do what they are unfit for.

IMMIGRATION.—A bill for encouraging the importation of free European laborers into this colony, to be presented to the Legislative Council by Mr. Advocate de Wet, has appeared in last *Gazette*.

The existing law, which prevents such introduction, is removed by this bill, and it provides further that henceforth, any contract, covenant, or agreement entered into, in writing, in any place in Europe, according to any law in force within such place, with any servant born in Europe for the performance of personal, domestic, manufacturing, or agricultural service or labour, shall be, within this colony, of force and effect, and binding upon the parties or persons who shall have entered into the same, for the term therein stipulated, provided the term shall not exceed the period of five years from the day on which the servant shall have landed or entered in this colony, in which case such contract shall expire at the end of such period of five years.

BURGERSDORP.—**THE LATE RAINS.**—Accounts before us state that a great deal of rain has fallen in the Stormberg. On Friday last a heavy hail storm, accompanied with rain, thunder and lightning, passed over that quarter, doing considerable damage to the vegetation in the neighbourhood. The Stormberg Spruit was running over its banks on Friday night, and the post boy with the mail from Burgersdorp to Alivil, found great difficulty in crossing that stream. The road between Melk Spruit and Alivil has more or less been cut up, consequently is now in a very dangerous state. The same storm passed over Alivil, doing, we believe, damage in that quarter also. Buffels Vley, situated a short distance from the village, was flooded, through the vast quantity of water accumulating there, carrying everything before it into the Orange River. The temporary bridge over one of the streams leading into the village was washed away and besides other damage done. The River, owing to this body of water, was on Saturday last fully ten feet higher than what it was last flooded. Burgersdorp on Sunday morning, was also visited by a great deal of rain. The houses were put to the test, and with the exception of a few instances it stood it nobly. The only damage I have heard of in this town, caused by the rain, was among the brick kilns.—*Albert Times, Feb. 22.*
