## W O R C E S T E R .

Election of E. B. Watermeyer, Esq.

[Translation.]

To E. B. WATERMEYER, Esq.,  
Barrister at Law.

Worcester, 31st October, 1853.

SIR.—The unanimous approval which was testified by all Classes of our Co-Electors, when you were mentioned as a proper person to be one of the Representatives of our Division in the first Cape Parliament, encourages us to make the present respective application to you to allow yourself to be nominated as a Candidate for that office.

We had, for some time past, cherished the idea of securing your well-known abilities, your firm patriotism, and your perfect acquaintance with the affairs of this Country, and the requirements of all classes of its people, for the service not alone of our District, but of the entire Colony. But having been informed that another Division of the Colony had already obtained your consent to be nominated on its behalf, we, greatly to our regret, deemed ourselves obliged to surrender the hope thus entertained. On further inquiry we are much gratified to learn that we had been misinformed;—and trusting that our Division receives as favorable a place in your consideration as any other in the Colony, we now submit our application to you with every hope of your favorable answer.

Awaiting such a reply, we have the honor to subscribe ourselves,

GENTLEMEN.—I had the gratification of receiving at Graham's Town, on the 9th instant, your flattering request that I should give my consent to be nominated as a Candidate for the representation of the Division of Worcester in the new Parliament.

That a much earlier reply to your respected invitation has not been sent to you, will do me the kindness to sacrifice to the very limited time which the hurried business of Circuit has hitherto spared to me for the purpose; for I can tell you my warmest assurance that by no one could the honor you have done me have been more highly appreciated than by myself.

Immediately on the receipt of your letter, I gave its contents my anxious consideration, and I have come to the conclusion that, although, as you state, my name has been mentioned in connection with the representation of another Division of the Colony, I cannot, in accordance with my views of duty in the matter, decline the invitation which you have sent me on behalf of the Electors of the Division of Worcester. Since the gracious grant by her Majesty, of Constitutional privileges to this Colony, it has been my own wish to be placed in the position of giving my services, however slight their value, to the country of my birth, and I had made up my mind to endeavour to deserve the confidence of the first Constituency, which should do me the honor of formally applying to me on the subject. The names subscribed to your letter, being of gentlemen whom I know to possess much influence in your division, give me the fullest assurance, that however slight the extent to which I have yet earned their confidence, the electors of the important division of Worcester are not disinclined to accord it me, as one of the members of the House of Assembly.

My earnest efforts will be directed, if, in accordance with your desire, I am elected a member for your division, to do my duty in the many matters which will come under discussion in Parliament, not merely with reference to the interests of the division of Worcester, but to those of the entire Colony. It is, therefore, that a member for any division who professes true love for his country, ought not to look upon himself as representing only the division which sent him, although he ought not to lose sight of his local interests; but he should look upon himself as having been thought worthy by the constituency of his division to be their representative, &c. &c. the care of the concerns of the entire country—of all the districts—the inhabitants of the East as well as of the West; and he should be prepared to act as such honorably, and according to the dictates of his conscience.

Such I, at least, consider the duty of each of the representatives sent by the several districts; and I have little doubt that herein you fully agree with me.

It is my intention, as it is my duty, after my return to Cape Town, and after the elections for the Council have been concluded, to address the electors of Worcester fully, respecting my views of the present position of the Colony, and of the nature of the measures which ought to be adopted for the furtherance of its welfare. At the same time I must say that I cannot pledge myself to any specific measures, of any kind whatever; as in my opinion no one is entitled, in the present state of the country, to form any decisive judgment on any question of public importance, before he has had the opportunity of learning the whole, and being informed of the interests, of the entire community, through the representatives whom its several sections are to send to Parliament.

In the hope that I may prove myself fully worthy of the confidence you have expressed, and with every assurance that no efforts of mine shall be wanting to maintain that confidence. I have the honor to be, Gentlemen,
