## Flowers and Gardens

## Beautification of Bergzicht Sports Grounds

The co-ordinating committee of sport clubs in Stellenbosch, "Die Sentrale Sportskakeelkomitee", has also requested Council to extend its beautification programme to the Bergzicht playgrounds. Suggestions for the levelling and clearing of untended portions, and for the planting of oaks, other suitable trees and shrubs, have been submitted. I sincerely hope that it will be possible to provide funds on the estimates for next year.

## 1960 Estimates

## Klapmuts Road

Negotiations have been proceeding for some time regarding the possibility of improving the dangerous sharp curve of Klapmuts Road where it enters Bell Street. The route of this road will probably be changed considerably in the future but it is felt that this corner is so dangerous that certain measures must be taken in the meantime. Funds are limited, but a scheme for levelling out the dangerous turn has now been approved and it is hoped that the work will be carried out with a minimum of delay.

Next Thursday is Guy Fawkes day, when children of all ages will once again make merry with all kinds of crackers and fireworks. Boys will be boys, and I would in no way like to cast a damper on their gaiety, but at the same time I would like to sound a note of warning. It is actually forbidden to set off fireworks in streets and public places, and I wish

Ek dink almal sal saamstem dat hierdie biblioteek, met sy 5,000 nuwe boeke, van onskatbare waarde vir die Kleurlinggemeenskap van Stellenbosch kan wees, en ek hoop van harte dat nie alleen volwassenes nie, maar veral die jonger geslag, wel deeglik daarvan gebruik sal maak.

Hierdie biblioteek is daargestel ooreenkomstig die Provinsiale Biblioteekdiens. Elke drie maande sal die boeke in voorraad omgeruil word vir 5,000 nuwes. Die ondersoek aangaande die moontlikheid om die Provinsiale diens tot die plaaslike blanke biblioteek uit te brei, gaan nog voort.

## Group Areas

The Chairman of the Regional Group Areas Advisory Board, Dr. J. F. van Rensburg, and the Secretary, Mr. Greeff, called on me in the course of the week to discuss certain aspects of the prospective proclamation of the various group areas. A further report was promised in the near future.

We do not know when the areas will finally be defined in Stellenbosch, but it does seem as if matters are progressing. It is an uncertain and frustrating position at the moment, a state of affairs which retards development and which, in the Council's opinion, should be resolved at the earliest possible time.

## Restoration of Historic Buildings

My congratulations and best wishes are extended to the newly formed Stellenbosch Regional Committee of the Stigting Simon van der Stel. More details regarding the objects of this organisation and of the local committee will be found elsewhere in this issue. It is indeed fitting that one of the first branches to be formed should be in the second oldest settlement in the country, and one so rich in buildings of historical and architectural importance.

Those who share our feelings for these matters will also be interested in the series of lectures on the preservation and restoration of historic buildings to be held in Cape Town later this month. The purpose of this symposium, which is being organised by the Cape Provincial Institute of Architects, is to encourage the correct restoration of worthwhile buildings in their context. Perhaps I might mention the

lecture on the Municipal point of view in relation to these matters by Councillor Dr. Erika Theron on Wednesday night, November 25th. Further details regarding these lectures will no doubt be furnished in the press, or they can be obtained from the Municipal Offices.

## Donation of Blood

I have been requested by the organizers of the local blood transfusion service to point out that now that the annual exodus of University students is taking place, a very large portion of the Stellenbosch blood donors are no longer available. On the other hand it is a well-known fact that the number of road and similar accidents increase during the summer holidays, with the result that blood in considerable quantities is urgently needed for transfusion. Clinics for the donation of blood are regularly held in Stellenbosch and the organisers would greatly appreciate more members of the public offering their services.

## Street Trees

It has been felt for some time that more specialised attention could perhaps be given to the care of the street trees, especially our oaks. The main difficulty is shortage of staff. The appointment of a qualified tree surgeon would seem to be the ultimate solution, but unfortunately we cannot afford such an appointment at this stage.

A serious problem is caused by overhead electrical wires and trees interfering with each other, necessitating the trimming of the trees to a greater or lesser extent. This is an old headache and, in view of the prohibitive cost of underground cables, one which cannot always be solved to satisfaction. I can, however, assure the public that in the trimming of trees every possible care is taken to ensure that as little damage as possible is occasioned.

## Personalia

We would like to welcome our new Assistant Forestry Officer, Mr. P. W. Heunis, formerly of George, to the Municipal staff. Our Forestry Department is one of our main sources of revenue and the Council feels that its activities should be extended. This appointment should also make it

possible to grant more attention to the question of street trees mentioned above.

I am sure the public will join me in extending every wish for a speedy and complete recovery to Mrs. Hilda de Wet, the wife of Councillor Dr. J. C. de Wet, who is confined to bed at home; and also to our Professional Officer, Mr. W. Blersch, who was admitted to the local hospital for an operation during the week.
