KERKHOF TARIEWE

In n vorige verslag waarin die vertoë hanteer is vir die verlaging van die kerkhof tariewe vir behoeftige persone, is die praktiese probleme wat dit vir n Plaaslike Owerheid inhou, uitgestippel. In die verslag is ook aan die hand gedoen dat die aangeleentheid deur n welsyns departement aangespreek behoort te word. Weens 'n baie druk program kon 'n afspraak met Dr. Heraldien, die Hoof Direkteur van Welsynsdienste, eers op 16 Junie gereël word. Tydens die onderhoud is die probleem van behoeftige gesinne wat nie die tariewe kan bybring, met hom bespreek.

Sy reaksie was dat die Streeksregering in die Wes-Kaap terdeë bewus is van die spesifieke probleem onder arm gemeenskappe. Daar word op hierdie stadium deur sy departement gewerk aan h stelsel van Welsyn toelaes wat hierdie probleem van behoeftige persone sal aanspreek.

Die Stadsraad van Stellenbosch kom reeds persone tegemoet wat finansieel probleme ondervind ten opsigte van kerkhof gelde deurdat hulle:

- toegelaat word om self die graf te grawe. Die afgelope jaar egter het niemand van hierdie toegewing gebruik gemaak nie.
- aangemoedig word om h ekstra diep graf te koop, sodat dit twee keer benut kan word. Hierdie gerief word ook min van gebruik gemaak.

BEGRAFNISSE OP SATERDAE

Begrafnisse op Saterdae was in die verlede n rariteit, maar het die afgelope tyd so toegeneem dat bestaande personeel dit nie kan behartig nie en moes n beperking geplaas word op die aantal teraarde bestellings op Saterdae. Stellenbosch is die enigste dorp in die omgewing wat die hele Saterdag beskikbaar is en die Saterdag tarief is ook die laagste.

Dit word dikwels ondervind dat die oorskot oorgehou word sodat h Saterdag begrafnis uitgevoer kan word, wat die koste van die teraarde bestelling opjaag, en gebeur dit dat daar weeksdae verbygaan sonder dat h teraarde bestelling uitgevoer word. Die rede waarom addisionele gelde op Saterdae gehef word, is om die personeel (wat dikwels onwillig is om nog die hele Saterdag ook te werk) addisioneel vir hulle dienste te vergoed en om persone aan te moedig om liewers in die week te begrawe.

STELLENBOSCH AND ENVIRONS SUB-REGIONAL PLAN

NOTES OF A SPECIAL DEVELOPMENT WORKING COMMITTEE OF THE STELLENBOSCH DISCUSSION FORUM (SDF) HELD ON TUESDAY 2 AUGUST, 1994, AT THE LIBRARY HALL, STELLENBOSCH

Although five members from each of the Stellenbosch Discussion Forum's participating organisations were invited, the meeting was poorly attended.

Prof. Cawood acted as Chairman. In his opening statement the role of the SDF in the process of the drawing up of the *Stellenbosch and Environs Sub-regional Plan* was clarified.

Background documentation was put forward and explained. Both the Goals, Objectives, Policies and Strategies (GOPS) document as well as a summarised version of the document were made available to the public.

Dennis Moss sketched a brief overview of the GOPS document, raising certain issues and policies that had been put forward in the document. It was stressed that this document, as it were, provides an input created primarily to initiate public reaction.

David Shandler then addressed the issue of people's involvement in the process and the possible steps to carry the process forward.

It was recognised in the meeting that the aim is to reach broad public concensus on the goals, objectives, issues and policies (GOPS) raised. It was furthermore agreed by all present that a series of workshops would be an appropriate means of involving local communities in the preparation of the plan. In such workshops, then, detailed discussion of issues and policies and revision of documentation can take place.

The viability of the SDF as a vehicle to facilitate public participation in the planning process was raised (due to both it's future status and its degree of representation). The establishment of a special development forum for this purpose was put forward for consideration.

It was recognised that the planning process should be completely transparent, ie. all interested parties should be invited to take part and give input in the planning process. It was agreed that specialists from different fields would also be valuable in providing inputs in the planning process. Meetings convened and inputs gained should furthermore be advertised.

It was also voiced that a special communication committee be established.

The process should run as quickly and efficiently as possible. In the meeting it was recognised and agreed upon that this would largely depend on the community's commitment to the process.

Regarding the practicalities of the workshops and people's involvement, is was voiced in the meeting that the community itself should provide the names of persons and groups to be included in the planning process. The Subcommittee of the Development Working Group should get together and decide how to convene the workshops.

INTRODUCTION

Measured against conditions in most of the rest of Stellenbosch. the primary focus of the RECONSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (RDP) in the town should be on the Kaya Mandi township because of the precarious conditions in which the inhabitants live. especially those living in the large number of informal dwellings. There are nevertheless also other areas, especially parts of Cloetesville and Idas Valley, where considerable backlogs exist. Together with Kaya Mandi, therefore, these areas are concentrated on in this submission.

PLANNING

All projects tackled in Stellenbosch are carried out within the guidelines set out in the Metropolitan Development Framework, the Stellenbosch and Environs Subregional Plan, the Stellenbosch Spatial Development Framework and other more implementationoriented development plans for specific subjects or areas. An example of these last mentioned plans is the Short-Term Development Plan for Kaya Mandi, attached to this submission as Appendix A. (Nod attached - pervensing conclusion)

A comprehensive socio-economic study of Kaya Mandi has already been completed and a similar study of the remainder of Stellenbosch will be finished shortly. The infrastructure for Kaya Mandi has already been incorporated into that of Stellenbosch in terms of master planning of water, sewerage, transport and town planning. The expertise of specialist consultants has been utilised in each of these technical areas.

3.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

On 1 October 1992, the heads of departments of the Stellenbosch Town Council assumed responsibility for the management of Kaya Mandi. Since that date, under the auspices of the Stellenbosch Discussion Forum (SDF), more that 100 meetings have been held in the various technical and zone committees, in all of which the full spectrum of community leaders has been represented. A list of organisations represented in the SDF is attached in Appendix B. Arising from these meetings, a system has been implemented in terms of which the municipal area has been subdivided to form community based committees which manage both maintenance and capital projects in conjunction with the technical and financial A start has already been made with the delivery of team. services to meet the immediate needs of the occupants of informal housing units in particular. These services include the provision of clean water, electricity, toilet facilities and refuse removal.

Payment for these services takes place through the mediation of the technical and zone committees. and excellent progress is already being made in this regard.

4. LABOUR-INTENSIVE PROJECTS IN STELLENBOSCH

The principle of using labour-intensive projects is already well established in Stellenbosch, in both maintenance and capitai works. In fact the Stellenbosch Town Council recently decided formally to make use as far as possible of labour-intensive construction methods. The following examples serve to illustrate this:

- (a) The erection of approximately 100 toilets in Kaya Mandi, incorporating showers and laundry facilities, where about R150 000 to date has been channelled to the community in the form of wages.
- (b) The conducting of a socio-economic study of Kava Mandi in which some R20 000 went to the community as wages.
- (c) The erection of bathroom facilities in Cloetesville and Idas Valley where an amount of approximately R300 000 to date has been channelled to these communities as wages.

5. DISCUSSION

Appendix C provides motivation for a number of projects which have been specially selected for the deployment of labourintensive construction methods. Evaluation of these projects should be done in the light of the following facts:

- (a) Projects are approached holistically, within an overall and well-thought-out planning framework.
- (b) Projects and municipal services are managed by a professional team which has at its disposal the full infrastructure of the Stellenbosch Town Council as well as experts in the various specialised technical areas.
- (c) The community is involved from grassroots level in the management of municipal services and in the planning and implementation of projects.
- (d) In a relatively short space of time exceptional progress has been made as regards payment for services, particularly in the informal housing sectors.
- (e) The infrastructure for training is in place and there are already a number of successful labour-intensive projects underway in Stellenbosch.

These circumstances maximise the possibility of applying funds with optimum effectiveness and of maintaining the momentum of whatever development is initiated.

- 1. REFUSE REMOVAL (OPERATION) R230 000
- CLEARING UP SERVICES (OPERATION) 2

Like other services, refuse removal is also run along communityorientated lines. At this stage, however, not all the essential needs are being met. This project is especially suited to a labour-intensive approach because there is a vast amount of clearing up necessary, especially in among the informal housing units where access is limited.

SEWAGE REMOVAL (OPERATION) R200 000 з.

> The zone system makes provision for the residents in each zone to take responsibility for the upkeep and running of their own toilets and laundry facilities, including the opening of blockages in toilets and main pipes. As yet, however, not all the essential needs are being met.

4. STORM WATER (OPERATION)

> Because the essential needs for refuse removal are not being adequately met. blockages occur in the storm water system. resulting in the frequent flooding of informal housing.

5. ELECTRICAL RETICULATION : INFORMAL HOUSING R1 430 000

> Legal power connections are not yet widely available for the informal housing units. This means that illegal power connections cannot merely be removed without further ado. The provision of legal power connections and especially the digging of trenches for cables is a project particularly suited to labour-intensive methods.

6. PREPAID ELECTRICITY METERS

> Because of the high unemployment rate in Kaya Mandi there are large numbers of households which are not in the position to pay for electricity meters. This hampers the implementation of a system where every household has a legal connection and where power is paid for on a permanent basis.

13 BUS STOP SHELTERS

Early in June 1994, following a town planning, traffic and pedestrian study, these projects were identified by specialist consultants as essential to normalise the situation in Kava Mandi. Approximately 70% of all persons leaving Kaya Mandi do so on foot. Of those using other modes of transport 38% use cars, 37% taxis and 35% bus transport.

14. TOILETS : INFORMAL HOUSING

Apart from approximately 100 toilets and washing facilities recently erected by labour-intensive methods, there are virtually no basic facilities for the nearly 5000 residents in informal housing units.

> Early in 1994, following the incorporation of the sewerage and water systems of Kaya Mandi into the master planning of Stellenbosch, these projects were identified by specialist consultants as essential to normalise the situation in Kava Mandi.

21. BUSINESS HIVE

22. INDUSTRY HIVE

> The unemployment rate among potentially economically active persons in Kava Mandi is over 60%. The establishment of a business and industry hive, together with the implementation of labour-intensive projects, is an attempt to face up to this problem seriously.

23.

SERVICES : COSTA SMIT GROUND

The design and specifications for services on this ground have already been fully completed. There are currently no funds available for the development of services, a situation which delays bringing relief to the serious and urgent housing need in the area.

Unless a start is made very soon to the installation of services, the danger exists that the ground will be taken over by the setting up of informal housing units.

24. HOUSING

There are more than 1600 informal dwellings in Kaya Mandi which must be replaced by formal housing. The occupants of these dwellings live in <u>desperate</u> circumstances. There has already been wide consultation within the community on this issue and meeting this housing need is generally acknowledged as one of the highest priorities.

25. SLAUGHTERING FACILITIES

Slaughtering of livestock takes place on a daily basis in Kaya Mandi. Sometimes this happens in the immediate proximity of surface sewage run-off. To eliminate this health hazard it is vital to provide the necessary facilities without delay.

30. ESTABLISHMENT OF SMALLHOLD FARMERS

The Stellenbosch Municipality has at its disposal a considerable amount of good agricultural land which can be utilised for the establishment of smallhold farmers. especially those drawn from the less developed communities. In addition to the estimated 100 job opportunities that would be created during the implementation stage. this project offers the advantage of providing long term employment.

B. CLOETESVILLE AND IDAS VALLEY

- 1. STORM WATER : JACARANDA, PINE AND PRIMROSE R570 000
- UPGRADING OF TOWN SOUARE/PARK

The area affected by the implementation of the above projects forms the heart of Cloetesville. Recurrent winter flooding of a large number of homes in the immediate vicinity can be prevented by the implementation of these projects. The transformation of this neighbourhood, which currently constitutes the core of gang activities in Cloetesville. represents an intervention not only at the level of job creation but also at the level of socio-economic upliftment.

STORM WATER DRAINAGE : EX STATION SITE R 440 000

Adequate street and storm water drainage were not provided in this area when it was developed, with the result that homes are continuously damp during winter. There are also numerous houses with leaking roofs. The visit of concerned residents to the Stellenbosch Municipality on 1994-06-27 has accentuated the seriousness of the problem.

COMMUNITY HALL

Only limited facilities for sport and recreation exist for either Cloetesville or Idas Valley. This lack of basic facilities has hampered the growth of both informal and formal sporting and recreational activities. a situation which in turn gives rise to certain associated socio-economic problems.

BUS STOP SHELTERS

Because of the high utilisation of public transport, this project represents a response to a very substantial need in the community.

HOUSING : SCHOONGEZICHT

At present there is an urgent need for more than 1000 new homes in Cloetesville and Idas Valley. The above amount includes provision for the installation of services.

TOILETS : EXISTING HOMES

There are approximately 300 houses in Cloetesville and Idas Valley with no more than squatting pans available as toilets. In most cases these facilities are no longer serviceable, giving rise to storm water penetration of the sewerage system and the overloading of sewage purification works.

10. ERECTION OF NEW POLICE STATION

The existing facilities at the Cloetesville police station are no ionger adequate. It is vital that community development be accompanied by effective policing. The building of a new police station by labour-intensive means also offers an ideal opportunity to bring police and community closer to one another.

12. UPGRADING OF KROMME RIVER

The poor condition of these rivers results chiefly from the inadequacy of services such as sewerage and refuse removal in the area. Viewed holistically, however, it makes no sense to deal with the problem of services only, while leaving the poor condition of the rivers untouched. The advantages to the community of combining the provision of basic services such as sewerage and refuse removal with labour-intensive projects to clean up and maintain these rivers cannot be overestimated.

13. PREPAID ELECTRICITY METERS

Because of the high unemployment rate in Cloetesville and Idas Valley there are large numbers of households which are not in the position to pay for electricity meters. This hampers the implementation of a system where every household has a legal connection and where power is paid for on a permanent basis.

14. INDUSTRY HIVE

This labour-intensive project is recommended as one which contributes to solving both the short and long term problems of high unemployment.

15. TRAINING CENTRE

As a result of historical circumstances, the overwhelming majority of persons involved in labour-intensive projects is untrained. It is essential to provide a suitable training centre to ensure that, through training, there is an optimum utilisation of funds and at the same time that individuals are equipped to make a greater contribution to the country's economy in the future.

16. UPGRADING OF SUB-ECONOMIC HOUSING

In Cloetesville and Idas Valley there are considerable numbers of houses in a condition which can be described as nothing better than informal housing. There are instances where informal additions to houses have been constructed right over sewerage manholes and where sewage water has run out in a kitchen when a blocked sewerage pipe has caused the manhole to overflow. These houses are flooded several times every winter and have leaking roofs. This situation is fraught with health hazards and the areas referred to are the core of gang activities. This project thus represents an intervention not only in the field of job creation but also of socio-economic development.
