GENTLEMEN.—I feel much honored and gratified at the address you have lately yourselves warranted in presenting me this day, conveying your appreciation and approval of my proceedings in Parliament as a member of the Legislative Council, and however I may regret I do not possess the Legislative facilities which ought to distinguish my position, I can say, without pride or vanity, that no one feels a greater desire to promote the welfare and prosperity of the colony than I do, and I assure you my energies and abilities shall always be devoted to that end.

I only regret my numerous and responsible avocations have hitherto prevented me from taking that active part in important measures, such as Public Roads, Education, &c., during the recess, as I would wish, I trust my local knowledge of the wants and requirements of the colony, and all other colonial matters, will enable me to check the passing of any enactment which may be injudicious to the interests of the colonists. Frontier Affairs.

The following particulars of the recent events of a portion of the Shalibe Kafirs, near King William's Town are from an authentic source.—Sivani was threatened with an attack from his own people last Tuesday (Sept. 2), because he seized a number of his cattle as a punishment for believing what the prophet in Krell's country had said—that they must kill their cattle, and others of a better description would rise from the earth. He ordered them not to kill their cattle, and declared that the prophet was a liar. They took no notice of his commands, whereupon the remaining cattle of the disobedient kraals were carried off by him to his own place. The Kafirs then collected, to the number of two or three hundred, armed with assegais, and yelling a good deal. When we saw them gathering, we thought they were coming to attack us, so we sounded the "assault" and all hands turned out; but presently Sivani appeared in saying he had fled for his life, and that his people had come to eat him up, and they gathered round his kraal, but touched nothing, imagining, I suppose, that he would render their chief assistance. They, however, dispersed during the night. We stood to our arms all the afternoon, and the men slept in accoutrements all night. When the affair commenced, we sent an express off to King William's Town, and early yesterday morning, Sept. 3, Mr. George Grey, accompanied by Col. Bisset and Mr. Ayff suddenly appeared in our square. They were fatigued with travel, and returned to King William's Town at 10, after a few minutes conversation with Sivani. Up to the leaving of the post no further movement had taken place.

Up to the leaving of the post no further movement had taken place.

The chief Sivani has thrown himself into no little trouble by his devotion to government interests. It appears that during the late excitement caused by the rumour of war, a number of his people, proceeded to the Galeska ter-

itory, in order to see the prophet, receive his benediction, or for some other non-sacred reason. This pilgrimage took place when the cattle-killing mania was at its height. The distinguishing characteristic of the Kafir—love of cattle—was, it is said, "clearly manifested by these devotees, who endeavoured to combine worldly advantage with the performance of what they evidently considered to be a religious duty. Accordingly, a considerable number of cattle was purchased by them during their stay, with which they returned to their own country, declaring that the animals had been raised from the earth by Sivani and his family for protection. Sivani himself appeared in King William's Town on Wednesday week last, and Sir G. Grey, it is said, paid a visit to the Tamacha on the morning of the same day, with what object has not yet transpired."

The same paper gives the particulars of a fatal accident which occurred on the 4th instant. It seems that at 1 o'clock on the morning of that date, a soldier of the Cape Mounted Rifles, who was also the driver of a cart, and had only arrived in King William's Town with the Governor's escort, on the Tuesday previous, was proceeding from the barracks to the rear, when, being entirely ignorant of the locality, he walked suddenly over the precipitous side of a quarry—which is some ten or twelve feet in depth. The poor fellow was found perfectly lifeless some time after daylight, his neck having been broken by the fall. The corpse was buried with military honours, on Friday afternoon, being followed by a number of the companions of the deceased, and preceded by the trumpets of the 60th Royal Rifles.

KAFIRLAND.—Although we can vouch for the accuracy of our Kafir intelligence, we would not by any means advise our exposed border inhabitants to place too great a stress upon it, or to construe it into actual hostilities. On the contrary, we think that matters are in much the same state as they have been in for some months past—neither better nor worse but requiring great caution and judgment on the part of the authorities, and that, as we have before observed, there is no danger of an "immediate" outbreak. Nevertheless, there can be very little doubt about the wisdom of every colonist being prepared for the worst, for, by that means and skilful management on the part of those who hold the reins of power, war may be staved off for an indefinite period, or (and more impossible things have happened) even warded off altogether.

In respect to the attack on Mr. Crouch's wagon, it appears to us that an innate desire for plunder was aroused by seeing a solitary wagon so far away from any available assistance, and that the Kafirs, in obedience to this impulse, watched their opportunity and pounced upon those in charge whilst they were asleep. The fact that the suspected people are so willing to make a confession, in my opinion, is sufficient proof that the attack was not made with any ulterior design of bringing about war, but that the abstract idea of something to be acquired was the all-powerful inducement; for when the Kafirs are thoroughly prepared for war, they are very unwilling to make amends for any injuries they may commit.

Our latest accounts from the Galeska territory show that the slaughtering of cattle has not by any means ceased, though it is unaccompanied by that frenzy of excitement which marked the commencement of the work.—*Anglo-African*.

On Monday morning last the wagon of Mr. Crouch, the trader, was attacked on the Kosiagh, a river about fifteen miles distant from the Kei. It appears that at 3 a.m., on the day in question, the drivers and people in charge were aroused from their slumbers by a number of Kafirs, who, without any ceremony or palaver, immediately commenced knob-kerrying them. The men thus attacked fought bravely and unflinchingly for some time, and the ground was covered with their bodies. One of Mr. Crouch's men was severely wounded in the affray.—*Ibid.*

Fort Pater.—(Communicated).—Nearly all the farmers in Lower Victoria have left their places and gone to their homes, but I learn from many of them, that they are far from being free from apprehensions with regard to the Kafirs. It has been said that the Kafirs have ceased to kill their cattle, &c. They may not be killing them to the same extent as they were a month ago, but still numbers are destroyed daily by most of the tribes. The road from Line Drift to King William's Town is anything but safe travelling as it is now infested by marauding Kafirs; in proof of which I have just heard from John Forrester, my neighbour that three of his oxen were stolen while he was outspanned at the Blue River, about six miles from King William's Town, on Tuesday morning last—the very day on which the Governor arrived there! One of the Randles, another neighbour, states that he had four oxen out from his wagon under the walls of Fort Pato, and the thieves got clear off with 3 of them, on Tuesday last. If this insecurity continues, a considerable rise in freight will be inevitable. I cannot avoid giving the Dutch and English farmers much credit for the timely interview they had with his Excellency at Alice on Monday last, as the sentiments they expressed as to the accordance with those entertained by the farmers generally; and I trust that Sir George Grey will see the necessity, now he is in Kafirland, of taking such steps as will induce the chiefs to exercise more control over their people than to suffer them to commit these depredations on the property of the colonists. I know that the farmers are most anxious to learn the result of his Excellency's visit to the chiefs, and trust that it will be of a satisfactory nature, but I confess I am sceptical.—*G. T. Journal*.

LAUNCH OF THE "ADRIATIC."—The steamship *Adriatic*, was launched on the 7th April, in the presence of more than thirty thousand persons. She is, says the *American Star*, the largest steamship ever built in this country, and is at present the largest vessel constructed of wood in the world. The *Adriatic* is 334 feet in length, 50 feet in breadth of beam, 33 feet 2 inches depth of hold, and registers 5,888 tons custom house measurement. She is to have two oscillating engines, of two thousand actual horse-power each; 100 inch cylinders, with twelve-foot stroke. She will have eight tubular boilers, low pressure, and about thirty pounds to the square inch. She will also have eight watertight compartments; these are to be constructed of solid oak planks, three inches thick, placed diagonally against each other, with layers of pitch and felt between them, making a total thickness of six inches, and shored in the most substantial manner. She is to be brigg-rigged; and, like the other steamers of the Collins' line, is without a bowsprit. Her anchors weigh seven thousand pounds each. Among other appliances of safety, the *Adriatic* will be furnished with one of Professor Graham's calcium lights, so arranged, with a reflector placed upon the starboard wheel house, as to throw a light upon the ocean sufficiently brilliant to enable those on board to see any object one mile in advance of the ship's track.

HURRICANE IN THE UNITED STATES.—On Saturday week a tornado sprung up from the Jersey shore, cutting this city with its edge, but doing no great damage. It passed over Philadelphia, doing great damage, particularly in the district of Kensington. Five houses were utterly demolished, 150 more were injured; these included five churches, a schoolhouse three manufactories, and other substantial buildings. Nine persons were seriously injured, and the loss by destruction of property amounted to one hundred thousand dollars. Twenty freight cars were blown down a street a distance of 100 yards, and then thrown on the tracks. The tornado passed through Pennsylvania to

Ohio, and following the line of the Cleveland and Pittsburgh Railroad, did great damage in Allegheny, Salem, and other towns. One town in Columbiana county was reported to be in ruins. At Alliance one man was killed outright and several persons severely injured. At Newark, New Jersey, considerable damage was done. The tornado continued its ravaging strides, crossing the Ohio border, and traversed a strip of country probably 50 to 60 miles in width. At Lancaster a bridge, which cost 50,000 dollars, was blown down. From Pittsburg to Cleveland the blow seems to have reached its greatest force. The railway runs for a long distance through dense forests and, confined in this cut, the wind had resistless force. The tornado seems to have been governed by the laws which the philosophers have deduced from minute observations. Its course was regular, and extended over nearly a thousand miles of country, through which it passed in a few hours. It was a curious natural phenomenon, and will, doubtless, attract the attention of the *seers*.
