THE ZUID-AFRIKAAN.

Cape Town, October 8, 1857.

We have read with great pleasure a condensed report of a late meeting of clerks for concerting the means of obtaining from their employers a half-holiday on Saturdays. That such a meeting should have been agreed upon, and that the proceedings should have been characterised at once by moderation and firmness, are facts that reflect credit on the class whose interest it was intended to promote. We have no doubt of the success of this movement. The request is too reasonable to meet with opposition on a large scale. Supposing, for argument's sake, (what is most improbable) that employers should unite in a determination to insist on a full day's labor on Saturday, as on every other day of the week, would they have any chance of carrying the point with a high hand? Never. If they were to attempt it (but they have too much sense to try it) they would soon be made aware that the clerks are as necessary to their employers, as the employers are to their clerks. Every kind of labor, to be productive, requires intervals of rest. This applies to the merchant's clerk as much as to the field-laborer; to the student in his closet, no less than to the cooly on the wharf. The effect is similar whether we over exert the muscles of the body or the faculties of the mind; in either case fatigue is the result. Shall it be said that the occupation of the clerk does not severely tax either his bodily strength or his mental energies? Perhaps this might be granted without weakening his case. There is such a thing as mental weariness, induced by a dull routine of business recurring day after day, and keeping a man constantly busy without bracing him up—there is a tedious succession of monotonous occupations, which does not give healthy exercise to the faculties. These things together with the sedentary habits of the merchant's office prey upon the health and spirits of young men in general, but especially of those who are naturally of a lively disposition, and to whom greater exertions both of body and mind would be a relief. This is what is called recreation, at least one kind of it; and it was very appreciably observed by one of the speakers at the meeting referred to, that recreation with some people means study; it means turning your thoughts into a new channel. The cupidity of employers in the great manufacturing towns of England at one time extended the labor of factory children over 15 hours a day. The effects on the health of the sufferers was such, that it became the duty of government to interfere, and working hours for juveniles were fixed by law at 12 in the 24, and we believe they have since been reduced to 10. MACALEER, in a speech on the 10 hours bill, delivered in 1846, has these remarkable words: "The natural difference between Campania and Spitzbergen is trifling when compared with the difference between a country inhabited by men full of bodily and mental vigour, and a country inhabited by men sunk in bodily and mental decrepitude. Therefore it is that we are not poorer but richer, because we have through many ages, rested from our labor one day in seven. That day is not lost. While industry is suspended, while the plough lies in the furrow, while the Exchange is silent, while no smoke ascends from the factory, a process is going on quite as important to the wealth of nations as any process which is performed on more busy days. Man, the machine of machines, the machine compared with which all the contrivances of the WATTS and ARKWRIGHTS are worthless, is repairing and winding up, so that he returns to his labors on the Monday with clearer intellect, with livelier spirits, with renewed corporal vigour. Never will I believe that what makes a population stronger, and healthier, and wiser, and better, can ultimately make it poorer." Every word of this applies to the merchant's clerk as well as to the factory child. Give him a fair opportunity of refreshing his thoughts and exercising his limbs, and you will get more and better work out of him in five days and a half than in six.

By recent accounts from Germany the vineyards along the Rhine gave promise of an abundant harvest. KAFIR LABORERS.—There are at present about 180 Kafirs confined in Amsterdam battery, and 37 more are probably now on their way from East London. The Governor has offered the services of these men, and such other as shall from time to time be available—prior to being applied to the Cape Town Municipality, upon condition that whilst the Government provides the lodging and guard, the Municipality shall provide their food, or pay for their rations, and continue, as at present, to supply the necessary superintendence. On Monday last the matter was considered by the Commissioners, and it was unanimously resolved to accept of the services of all these men under the above stipulations.

Sudden Death.—During the confirmation service held by Dr. Robertson at Swellendam on the 31st instant, an old man, about 70 years of age, suddenly fell down, and on being carried into the vestry, immediately expired.

CAUTION TO PARENTS.—A child of a man named Duveling residing in Hout-street, was left standing beside a bucket of water on Saturday last, and losing its balance fell into the bucket. No help being at hand, it was unfortunately drowned.
