Foreign Intelligence.

THE GALE - During Tuesday night and Wednesday morning a furious gale raged round our coast. Though we received accounts of shipwreck and death from almost every port, all losses are dwarfed beside that of the Royal Charter, which took place on Tuesday night.

Another GALE - A severe gale of wind from west by south prevailed through the southern districts of England on Tuesday. In London some lives were lost and much damage was done. A labourer was blown off a scaffolding into the Surrey Canal and drowned.

FRANCE - After all that has been said an imperial speech has been made at Bordeaux. The Emperor and Empress arrived there on Monday. The town was filled with country people who wished with the citizens in the display of their enthusiasm.

While this was going on a fearful scene was being enacted in the saloon. An attempt had been made by a Mr. Hodges, a clergyman, to perform a service; but the violent thumping of the vessel on the rocks, and the sea which poured into the cabin, rendered this impossible.

A rescued passenger states that the vessel rode safely burning blue lights and rockets until her masts were cut away, when the crew ceased to work, and she went on the rocks as two a.m. on Wednesday, and broke up about seven.

From all important ports on the south and west coast we hear of shipwreck and disaster. A schooner with all hands is reported lost at Berryhead in Devonshire. At Dover, a small vessel named the Pilot missed the entrance to the harbour and was dashed to pieces on the stone work, three men being drowned.

The gale blew with tremendous violence at Portland, and much damage has been done to the temporary woodwork of the breakwater. The greatest damage sustained is about 600 yards from the shore in the vicinity of the first pier-head, and at this point an immense gap of about 200 feet in length has been made in the support, the timber from which has been thrown on the beach in all directions.
