







most. The pilot-boat, which had kept in the vicinity, sent out a boat to the rescue of the crew, who were on hatches and planks in the water. Twenty were saved, but, unhappily, the captain, a passenger (an Italian), and four of the crew were drowned. The survivors were taken into Portmouth harbour, and met with a most hospitable reception at the Royal Sailor's Home. An inquest was held on September 28, on the body of Captain Thompson, which was picked up at Spithead the same morning. The jury returned a verdict of accidental death, adding their opinion that greater care should be taken in the securing of hatchways of sea-going ships.

**MISSING STEAMER.**—The screw steamer Venice, of Sunderland, is missing, and it is feared that she has been lost. The Venice sailed from Cardiff for Trieste, laden with coal and iron, about the middle of August. Shortly after her departure the heavy fog came on which caused so much loss of life and property in the St George's Channel, and she has never since been heard of. The Venice was comparatively new vessel, having been launched about the same time as the Florence. She was built of iron, and registered 520 tons.
