Original Correspondence. Calvina, 21st November, 1868. Sir.—In my last I stated that in the event of the Government not sending us some protective, evil effects would ensue from culpable negligence which had not been provided for, as will be seen from the following particulars.

On the 14th and 15th inst. the Korannas came in large force to the farm occupied by the Messrs. Burgers, Nel, and Croywagen, forcibly entered their houses, rifled their boxes, drove the families into the veldt and then levanted, carrying off as spoil 60 oxen, 400 horses and oxen, 8 wagons, and 2 carts, leaving men, women and children entirely destitute of food and clothing.
