If they are sincerely intent on doing justice, and admit their liability to error, why should they relinquish the benefit to be derived from borrowing the light of the Supreme Court? But, say they, lawyers cannot judge of a departure from doctrine; in cases of heresy their opinion goes for nothing. We argued that point on a former occasion and then showed that, where the proceedings are properly conducted, every heresy is reduced to the simple proposition, whether certain definite terms proved to have been used by defendant impugn any particular portion of the standards, specially referred to in the indictment.
