REPLY OF MR. WICHT.
The Hon'ble JOSEPH BARRY, Esq., and J. B. EBDEN
J. H. REDELINGHUYIS and P. G. VAN DER BYL,
Esq., and the other Gentlemen who have signed the
Requisition.

GENTLEMEN—I have the honour to acknow-
ledge the receipt of your letter, requesting
me to allow myself to be nominated as Member for
Cape Town in the place of Mr. Advocate DENYSSEN,
who has been elected to the Bench.
Although I had no intention or desire to enter
upon Parliamentary life, I do not feel myself at
liberty to decline a request made by so many of my
fellow-citizens, representing so many and such varied
interests, and possessing such large and widely-
extended influence. I, therefore, at your request,
consent to stand. I do not flatter myself that I am
calculated to make much figure in Parliament, nor
can I believe or hope to satisfy all parties; but I
shall strive to act and vote conscientiously; and I
hope I know sufficient of myself to be able to pre-
sume that no measure will find in me an advocate or
opponent that I do not honestly believe to be calcu-
lated to promote the best interests of the colony.
For one who has lived so long amongst you, and
whose life has been such as to make his fellow-
citizens familiar with his opinions on most of the
public questions of the day, it is quite unnecessary
to make a declaration of his political faith. I shall
be prepared to enter upon this topic on the day of
nomination, so that, if there are among the Electors
any unacquainted with my political views, they will
not be asked to vote for me in the dark. Suffice it
to state here, that every measure of progress, either
political, commercial, or educational, will find in me
a firm and ready supporter.

Though I have not sought this honour, and enter
upon it with some reluctance, at the request of your-
selves,—backed and urged upon me by many other
friends,—I can assure you, Gentlemen, that if by
your influence, and the favour of the Electors, I
am returned to the House of Assembly as one of
its Members, you will find that I will not shrink
from the duties, nor the performance of my
obligations to the inhabitants of Cape Town and the
colony.
