## The Paarl Bank.

Twelfth Annual Report of the Directors of the Paarl Bank to the Shareholders, at the Annual Meeting held on the 15th February, 1865.

YOUR DIRECTORS are again enabled to report favorably on the transactions of the past year.

The Accounts laid on the table show that the aggregate of Discount, Commission and Interest on Bills, Bonds, &c. during the period stated (including Balance of £637 12s. 9d. of the previous year) amounts to £3,822 12s. 1d., which, after deducting all current Expenditure and Interest on Fixed Deposits, leaves a Balance of £2,518 18s.

Of this amount Directors propose to divide the usual sum of £1,800 amongst the Shareholders, being equal to Nine per cent. on the paid-up Capital, and to leave the Balance of £718 8s. to the credit of Profit and Loss.
