considered to be fairly started, but as I took a very great interest in the success of my undertaking, all came right in time. One of my mistakes, which I hereby warn you all against, was having too great partiality for the white horn goats. They are, in fact, much larger than the straight horned goats but are not nearly so sure or docile. I have now been farming with these goats for the last seven years. I can assure you that they yield me a return for all my outlay, and allow me a little over (sheers). I have had nose but imported stock, and have gone altogether for angora goats. I believe that we will still be able to effect considerable improvements in these animals for I am fully persuaded that we have not got the right thing yet. Merino sheep are undoubtedly a benefit to the colony, and those who have lots of merino sheep may be considered well off for they are the people who can live. When merino sheep were introduced, they did not receive a very hearty welcome, for it is proverbial that our Cape farmers do not like novelty. Now they are the great desideratum. It is just the same with angoras; few people have taken any pains in breeding them, and yet gentlemen if I were to hear tonight that my angoras were gone, I would consider myself in every sense of the word a poor man, and therefore, I am sure, ere when I advise you and that in strong terms, to become possessed of angora goats. They do not get "brad riekte." Our revenue is considerably increased since we got the merino sheep among us. I assure you that if angora breeding is only entered into with the same spirit as such angora hair as wool, it is able to export quite as much as wool. I have been for asking you to join me in drinking success to agriculture I must remark that the Eastern Province, owing to the many drawbacks alluded to is not ahead of the West in this respect, but is on the contrary, not nearly so far advanced. These matters will all come right in time. I (as I have said) have not got the right thing at heart; and therefore, gentlemen, I beg you to drink with me the success of agriculture and all connected with it. Mr. Ziervogel sat down amid continued cheering. When a moderate degree of quiet had been restored.

Mr. Taupe, in reply, said:—Gentlemen, I am half a farmer and half a lawyer. My friend, Mr. Ziervogel, has been talking about the superiority of the Eastern over the Western Province. Gentlemen, I am very much against exciting this strong feeling between the provinces. I think we ought to look at it in another light; we are residents in one colony, and if one province prospers the other profits by that success. The Westerns are, without doubt, at present far in advance of their Eastern neighbours. Mr. Ziervogel directed your attention to the exports on the part of the East. I wish to remind you that he forgot to say, that nearly the whole of the Orange Free State and Transvaal Republic, together with Kaffraria, is included in those returns. This is putting the matter in another light. The wool of the Eastern Province will not bear comparison with that of the West in any way. I have lately been right through the Western Province. I went for the sole purpose of gaining knowledge in farming affairs; and I could not have gone to a better place. The sheep I saw were first-rate—the merino of Mr. Kitz, of Riversdale, Hottentot-Rivierdale, surpassing anything I have seen. Gentlemen, I had heard of farms, but I did not understand what a farm really was until I saw the different farms of which I am now going to tell you. I will first tell you of Fairfield, in the district of Napier, the property of John van der Byl, Esq. I there saw 9,000 fine sheep in excellent condition, all these were in perfect health, which I attribute to the several good sheds I saw. This gentleman, like wise, has a very superior lot of agricultural implements, which were all well taken care of. The wine and fruit grown on this farm are good as it is possible to find and the fruit, I can assure you, is excellent. The breadstaple district I visited Nakhwaga, the farm of Alexander van der Byl, Esq., where I saw that horse breeding was properly carried out. This gentleman's sheep were also in first rate order. I also had the pleasure of seeing the fine lambs Zeekeegat, belonging to Hendrik van der Byl, Esq., all of that district. There I was really astonished at the perfect working order of everything connected with the farm; all the agricultural implements, of which I saw a perfect collection, were under cover. A farm building, one hundred feet long, built of hard brick and pointed with lime, was together with an extensive range of sheds, together with the complete work I have seen; the whole of the business of the farm being carried on with the greatest regularity and order that it was quite a treat to me to see. I must not forget to mention the excellent farm Bloemhof, belonging to Messrs. A. and M. Neethling, where I saw the prize-winning sheep of that district. I was likewise exceedingly good order, and the neatness of everything I saw was really quite refreshing. I have been doubtfully so to an Eastern Province man. I cannot tell you of all I saw, but time would not admit, but suffice it to say that the farms that I visited have all added greatly to my stock of knowledge, for had I not seen for myself to what perfection farming could be brought, I would have looked upon the whole as fiction. It was on this account, gentlemen, that I called myself only half a farmer. I feel myself unworthy of the name of farmer until I see on the knowledge I collected. I very much regret that I was prevented from going to the several other fine farms I heard of on my upward journey, and which I intended visiting on my return had not an unforeseen accident—the burning of my horses at Somerset West—deprived me of this pleasure. I strongly recommend all my young friends assembled here to take a trip to the Western Province farms; they will learn more than will amply repay them for the trouble and expense they are put to. People have said that the fertility of the Cape farmers is dying out. I did not find it so, and no distinguished trait is in greater activity than that of the praiseworthy hospitality. I would, before resuming my seat, for a few moments big to draw your attention to the difference in getting up the Eastern and Western Province wool. In the East, as has been said, it is got up anyhow, while in the West great attention is paid to the washing in the first place,—no getting up yolk; but after well dried, the shearing is commenced in a building erected for that purpose. The wool is then separated, that from the east the portion of the fleece is tied up and put on tables made of lattice work, through which every particle of sand or dirt falls, thus freeing the wool from all impurities. In the Western Province it pays to do this, for the wool-dealers discriminate between good and bad wool and give much more for that upon which care has been expended in the getting up. I have for some years been doing all I can to bring about this state of things. I have, as I said, not yet attained perfection, but still my endeavours have, to a certain extent, met with their reward. This year I got one shilling and sixpence for all my wool which as I said at Mossel Bay had I had any idea that the West would certainly have brought such a success. I would certainly have thought wool and other things for exhibition; but I will take the bill by the horns next time. Gentle men, let us sink our differences as Eastern and Western Province men, and unite like good Afrikaners to promote the welfare of our Africa. As but half a farmer, I don't whether I am justified in taking upon myself, the pleasing duty of responding to "Success to Agriculture," but as we are just on the confines of the Western Province and in a part of the country where it is a difficult matter to find even half a farmer, I hope you will pardon me. Allow me then to thank you on behalf of the agriculturists for the hearty manner in which you responded to Mr. Ziervogel's call.

After this followed the Press, the Ladies and the Visitors. Mr. Korsten then addressed the company on the smallness of the quantity of tobacco which had been exhibited, as well as the inferiority of its quality, and recommended cultivators to improve the article as much as possible, with the view of keeping in the colony the large amount of money now annually sent to foreign parts. Toasts in honor of the dinner-committee and the band concluded the proceedings.
