ANNEXATION OF BRITISH KAFFRARIA.

ONE of the most difficult, as well as the most important questions with which our present Parliament will have to grapple, is unquestionably that of the annexation of British Kaffraria.

We need hardly remind our readers, that the amalgamation of the two colonies was alike opposed by both, when the idea was first mooted.

little reluctance, Mr. Cardwell did as he was bid, hurried the Annexation bill through Parliament, regardless of the Constitution Ordinance, and, timidly, but mildly ignoring the existence of such a thing as a Cape Parliament, proceeded in legislation for the Cape, as if it had been a portion of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland!

Our Parliamentary members do not at all seem inclined to endorse this proceeding on the part of the Governor and the Imperial Parliament, and have positively refused to loosen their hold on the purse-strings until this matter is satisfactorily adjusted.
