To J. R. ZEEBERG, Esq., M. D., T. Roos, Esq., A. J. Louw, Esq., and the other Gentlemen who signed the Requisition.
DEAR SIRS,—I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your numerous and industrially signed Requisition, requesting me to allow myself to be nominated as one of the Representatives for the Paarl Division in the next ensuing Parliament.
The kind way in which you have expressed your satisfaction of my acts during the thirteen years I had the honor of representing you, and the entire confidence you place in me as regards my future actions, compel me to respond to your call in the affirmative.
You say you require no pledge nor any statement of my Political principles—notwithstanding, I deem it incumbent on me to state what course of action I intend taking on some of the leading questions likely to be brought before the next Parliament.
As at present advised, I shall not vote for Responsible Government, but if at any future time I should in my mind be thoroughly convinced that such a change in our form of Government has become necessary, and will be of benefit to the colony, I shall not then hesitate in giving my support.
I shall not vote for the Voluntary Principles—and will be neither inclined to our Colonial Congress would admit to increase it, nor to reduce the grant in aid to Christian denominations, so that all could be equally aided.
Protection will receive my most serious consideration. I think it a large question, and dangerous ground to tread on, and shall therefore consider the matter well before I give my vote pro or con. Any measure brought forward in Parliament to equalize the Expenditure and Revenue of the Colony will always receive my most hearty co-operation.
I shall not vote to allow to other questions of minor importance, but assure you, if returned, I shall always use my endeavors to promote your interest and those of the whole Colony to the best of my ability.
