MALMESBURY DIVISIONAL COUNCIL.
The ordinary monthly meeting of the above council was held in the Court-room, Malmesbury, on the 4th May, 1869. Present: E. S. Foid (C. C.), chairman; Messrs. Louw, Visser, Brasier, Gid, Moorrees, Duckitt, and Eaton.
The minutes of the previous meeting were read and confirmed.
A letter was read from the Rev. W. E. Balson, respecting claim for payment for the erection of Beacons between the farms Ollant'sfontein and Orangefontein.
Resolved that the letter stand over until next meeting.
Report of Overseer House of the amount of work performed on the Mamre Road, during the past month, was read.
A letter was read from the Cape Divisional Council refusing to make any further payment on account of the Mamre Road until more progress had been made in the construction.
It was resolved, that the Cape Council be informed that this council is authorized, to see the statement made by the committee of the Cape Council in their report published in one of the newspapers as well as the conclusion they have arrived at in their letter now under discussion, which clearly proves that they could not have inspected the road properly, but have merely seen that part made from the junction of the old road on the Driefontein side, and not that portion which has already been completed from the Mamre side, nor does it appear that any examination was made of the quantity of gravel or stone already brought to the side of the road, and which is nearly sufficient to furnish the construction of the road. It was further resolved to forward an extract from the report of the overseer showing the amount of work already performed, and what is still required to be done to complete the road, and that the Cape Council be requested to reconsider their resolution and pay the 3rd instalment with the least possible delay.

It was resolved at the same time, to request the Cape Council to be good enough in future to give this Council notice when an inspection is to be made of any road in which this Council is interested, so enable one of its members to attend if necessary.
A letter was also read from the Cape Council on the subject of the construction of a bridge over the ravine at the Diep River.
It was resolved to inform the Cape Council that this Council cannot agree with the committee of inspection appointed by the Cape Council, when they state that they consider a causeway would answer the purpose of a bridge, and be far less expensive, as this Council is of opinion that the construction of a causeway over the ravine in question would be perfectly useless and would on all much more expense than a bridge, and it would be liable to be washed away by the first heavy rain, the approach from the Cape Town side being more or less steep, so to render it dangerous for any vehicle coming from that direction to pass over the proposed causeway.
A letter was read from the Colonial Secretary approving of the transfer of the Lease of the Oude Post Oupaan from Mr. J. D. Blatt to Mr. J. F. Haussamer.
A letter was read from the Piquetberg Divisional Council requesting that this Council should contribute half the expense of repairing the Berg River Bridge.

It was resolved to refer the Piquetberg Council to this Council's resolution of the 2nd Oct., 1866 offering to pay 1s. 3d. of the cost of keeping the bridge in repair and inform that body that this Council still adheres to that resolution.
A letter was read from Messrs. Fairbridge and Ardenre agreeing on behalf of Mr. Stephan to pay the balance of the costs incurred in the recent investigation of Deacons as Soldaten Post.
Mr. Visser, member of Council handed in his report on the state of the Trekpaths in his district.
A letter was read from Mr. Attorney Hofmeyer requesting on behalf of Mr. J. J. Kotze that the Council would proceed with the reserve of his farm Vlammink Vley, under the 93 Section of the Land Beacons Act.
Resolved that the usual notice be given in the Gazette, and that the appointment of a commissioner stand over until next meeting.
It was resolved that tenders be invited for the farm of the Mamre Toll for six months from 1st June next.
A letter was received from Mr. L. M. Rive, requesting to be exempted from the payment of Road Rates for 1869.
Resolved that the letter stand over.
Accounts amounting to £361 15s. 6d. being for expenditure incurred during the months of March and April last, having been passed the Council adjourned.

ROBERTSON.—A correspondent to the *Advertiser and Mail* says:—"This week, for this unusually quiet place, has been one of excitement. Monday was ushered in by partial showers and a breeze, and pick-axe on board, hurrying along to a rendezvous to which those who did not know their purpose wondered at. It soon got abroad that it was a party of volunteers to be making a wall around the Dutch Reformed Church burial-ground, which by this time is nearly completed; for when upwards of fifty willing people meet for real work, it soon verifies the old saying of 'many make light work,'—and a wall with a ditch of some four or five feet, dug out of a level ground soon yields to such a number, for they work with a determination, and as the Wesleyan ground, next to it, and already enclosed with a similar wall, seemed to cry aloud to the Dutch Reformed Church people have been so long backward. The Episcopal community have also a plot of ground close by, which requires care and repairs to the wall around. They are striving to get these done by their Bishop's arrival in the beginning of June, when his Lordship is to consecrate this and the church.
Tuesday, the usual day for weddings, was celebrated by two of these interesting affairs, with the brides in long flowing white veils, orange blossoms, &c., the brides decorated with pink and white ribbon; while the driver's frequent appreciation of his decorated whip made them prance and jump, to the delight of the lo-keepers.
At about 10 o'clock the Rev. Mr. Tindall left this for a six months' leave of absence to Europe. He was escorted a considerable distance by a large party in carts and horseback, including the Civil Commissioner and the minister of the Dutch Reformed Church, besides several on foot, who went to the end of the village to wish the respected missionary a "God-speed." The Sunday afternoon previous he had preached in the Dutch Reformed Church, which was crowded, and so was his own church in the evening, where he gave a farewell sermon. It is upwards of 33 years since the Rev. Mr. Tindall left his native land; and he looks forward still to a hearty greeting from several uncles, aunts, &c. We wish him a pleasant trip, and that he may return with increased health, to carry on the great work he has here established.
This week has also brought conspicuously out the party-coloured hand-bills of the candidates for Parliament—"Stem voor Retz" and "Stem voor Moodie" being the first started, but soon followed by that of "Stem voor J. Z. Human," the friend of the Boer and "Werksleiden." Why this latter is introduced is a puzzle and conjecture, for it is a well-known fact that Mr. Human boasts that he only pays his laborers one and three-pence a day, which only those of the more ragged sort can take; yet it is likewise true that within the last six weeks he has given more, as a sort of temptation to vote for him at this election.
Notices are placed at the Public Offices calling for tenders for the conveyance of the road party on Boekhuis Kloof to Cogman's Kloof, and also for rations while employed at the latter. This is a grand move in the right direction; and the Government deserve much praise for undertaking this road. It will entirely change the Montagu and Karroo farms, enabling the farmers to bring their produce to a better market; and no doubt the post to the frontier will, when the road is finished, travel this way, lessening the distance considerably.
This week brings another "action" forward, that of a concert on the 24th instant; and, judging by the programme a treat is promised, which was scarcely to be looked for in such an out-of-the-way place.
Several severe cases of whooping cough with inflammation have occurred.
While we are writing a good shower of rain is falling, which began in the night, and bids fair to last all day. This will be for the farmers of much use, for already have they put their ploughs, harrows, &c., in order, waiting for the first shower.
