The Premiums are payable yearly in advance; or at the option of the Assured, half-yearly, with a slight increase of rate.

This being a MUTUAL ASSURANCE SOCIETY, the profits are not as in Proprietary Companies, divided between the Partners and the Assured. The whole belongs to the Policy holders.

The Profits are divided amongst the holders of Policies, at the termination of every period of THREE YEARS, and each holder may determine that his share shall be added to the sum assured by him—by conversion into present payment—or applied in reduction of the future annual premiums payable by him.
